bemused Puzzled, confused, or bewildered.

Lucy looked a little **bemused**.

(of an area of land) lacking vegetation and exposed to the elements.

Bleak winds of the North Atlantic.

crestfallen Sad and disappointed.

He came back empty handed and **crestfallen**.

dejectedAffected or marked by low spirits.

Is **dejected** but trying to look cheerful.

(of an object or part of an object) in a lower position, having been pushed

depressed down.

A **depressed** fracture of the skull.

despair

The feeling that everything is wrong and nothing will turn out well.

One harsh word would send her into the depths of **despair**.

despairing Arising from or marked by despair or loss of hope.

The last **despairing** plea of the condemned criminal.

desperate Desperately determined.

I am **desperate** for a cigarette.

. Without or almost without hope.

She grew more and more **despondent**.

(of hopes or expectations) prevented from being realized.

disappointed The rising was a revolution of **disappointed** hopes.

disconsolate Very unhappy and unable to be comforted.

She left Fritz looking **disconsolate**.

Having lost confidence or enthusiasm; disheartened.

He must be feeling pretty **discouraged**.

__ Causing dejection.

The **dreary** round of working eating and trying to sleep.

Depressingly dark.

gloomyA **gloomy** corridor badly lit by oil lamps.

Very despondent, typically from grief or loss of love.

heartsick Too heartsick to fight back.

Certain to fail.

She handed me a **hopeless** jumble of papers.



Not producing any significant or desired effect. ineffective

An **ineffective** teacher.

Producing no result or effect. ineffectual The therapy was **ineffectual**.

Incapable of being dissolved. insoluble The problem is not **insoluble**.

Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. lost

Words **lost** in the din.

Put in the wrong place or position. **misplaced**

Misplaced tickets.

A way especially designed for a particular use. path

The missile traced a fiery **path** in the sky.

Without ability, influence, or power. powerless

Troops were **powerless** to stop last night s shooting.

The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or

pavement. road

They waited for a clear **road** at Hellifield Junction.

Destroyed physically or morally. ruined

The unsuccessful run for office left him **ruined** politically and economically.

Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

Facing the **stark** reality of the deadline.

A state of motor and mental inactivity with a partial suspension of

torpor sensibility.

stark

They veered between apathetic **torpor** and hysterical fanaticism.

Forced to turn and face attackers. trapped

Like a **trapped** animal.

unsuccessful

Failing to accomplish an intended result.

An unsuccessful attempt to enter Parliament.
