pantheism The worship or tolerance of many gods.

perversity Deliberately deviating from what is good.

polytheism

The belief in or worship of more than one god.

The **polytheism** of the ancient Near East.

proselytize Advocate or promote (a belief or course of action.

Davis wanted to share his concept and **proselytize** his ideas.

religion A particular system of faith and worship. He was raised in the Baptist religion.

tribunal A court of justice.
