- A person holding an opinion at odds with what is generally accepted.
- A person who holds unorthodox opinions in any field (not merely religion.

<u>apostate</u>	A disloyal person who betrays or deserts his cause or religion or political party or friend etc. After fifty years as an <b>apostate</b> he returned to the faith.
<u>critic</u>	A person who is professionally engaged in the analysis and interpretation of works of art. <i>Critics of the new legislation say it is too broad.</i>



disruptor	A person or thing that interrupts an event, activity, or process by causing a disturbance or problem. The film follows his evolution from Hollywood star to political <b>disruptor</b> .
dissenter	A person who dissents.
<u>dissident</u>	A person who opposes official policy, especially that of an authoritarian state. A <b>dissident</b> who had been jailed by a military regime.
freethinker	A person who believes that God created the universe and then abandoned it.
iconoclast	A destroyer of images used in religious worship.
misbeliever	A person who holds religious beliefs in conflict with the dogma of the Roman Catholic Church.
nonconformist	Someone who refuses to conform to established standards of conduct. Jenkins was a <b>nonconformist</b> who disdained the rugby union coaching certificate.
<u>questioner</u>	A person who asks questions, especially in an official context. <i>Questioners of the decisions of the church.</i>
religious outcast	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience.
<u>renegade</u>	A person who behaves in a rebelliously unconventional manner. <b>Renegade</b> s and Deserters of Heaven who renounce their God for the Favour of Man.
sceptic	A person inclined to question or doubt accepted opinions.
schismatic	Especially in the Christian Church a person who promotes schism an adherent of a schismatic group.

agnostic	Of or pertaining to an agnostic or agnosticism. Many common file formats JPEG MP3 etc are platform <b>agnostic</b> .
atheism	The doctrine or belief that there is no God.

atheistic	Related to or characterized by or given to atheism. Some were preoccupied with God others were <b>atheistic</b> to the core.

heterodox	Not conforming with accepted or orthodox standards or beliefs. <i>Heterodox views.</i>
<u>idol</u>	A person or thing that is greatly admired, loved, or revered. <i>A soccer idol</i> .
idolater	A person who worships idols.
idolatry	Extreme admiration, love, or reverence for something or someone. We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.
infidel	A person who does not acknowledge your god. A crusade against <b>infidel</b> s and heretics.
inquisition	A period of prolonged and intensive questioning. She relented in her determined <b>inquisition</b> and offered help.
irreligious	Indifferent or hostile to religion, or having no religious beliefs. An <b>irreligious</b> man.
monotheism	The doctrine or belief that there is only one God.
pagan	Relating to pagans or their beliefs. A Muslim majority had to live in close proximity to large communities of Christians and <b>pagan</b> s.
pantheism	The worship or tolerance of many gods.
perversity	Deliberately deviating from what is good. They responded with typical <b>perversity</b> .
polytheism	The belief in or worship of more than one god. The <b>polytheism</b> of the ancient Near East.
<u>pray</u>	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <b>Pray</b> to the Lord.



proselytize	Advocate or promote (a belief or course of action. Davis wanted to share his concept and <b>proselytize</b> his ideas.
religion	A particular system of faith and worship. <i>He was raised in the Baptist <b>religion</b>.</i>
theism	The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods. <i>There are many different forms of</i> <b>theism</b> .
tribunal	A court of justice. An industrial <b>tribunal</b> ruled that he was unfairly dismissed.
<u>worship</u>	The activity of worshipping. She adores her sons and they <b>worship</b> her.
