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
Hermit as a Noun

isolate A person or thing that has been or become isolated.

A country which is **isolate**d from the rest of the world.

isolated Far away from other places, buildings, or people; remote.

Could not remain the **isolated** figure he had been.

Denoting a hospital or ward for patients with infectious diseases.

He opposed a policy of American **isolation**.

lone (of a place) unfrequented and remote.

We sheltered under a **lone** tree.

loneliness (of a place) the quality of being unfrequented and remote; isolation.

The **loneliness** of the farm.

lonely Devoid of creatures.

Lonely old people whose families do not care for them.

lonesomeBeing the only one; single and isolated from others.

Spent a lonesome hour in the bar.

A male religious living in a cloister and devoting himself to contemplation

and prayer and work.

A state in which one is not observed or disturbed by other people.

She returned to the **privacy** of her own home.

recluse Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude.

She has turned into a virtual **recluse**.

reclusive Providing privacy or seclusion.

Lived an unsocial **reclusive** life.

remote A remote control device.

secluded Providing privacy or seclusion.

seclusion The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others.

A general cut in government spending.

Single Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing.

A **single** thickness.
