<u>expansive</u>	Able or tending to expand or characterized by expansion. <i>Wine made the guest expansive.</i>
<u>fearless</u>	Oblivious of dangers or perils or calmly resolute in facing them. <i>Fearless reporters and photographers.</i>
<u>gallant</u>	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>A gallant pageant.</i>

plucky	Marked by courage and determination in the face of difficulties or danger; robust and uninhibited. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
prodigious	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>Rumours of prodigious happenings such as monstrous births.</i>
<u>stalwart</u>	Strongly built and sturdy. <i>Proud of her tall stalwart son.</i>
stupendous	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The most stupendous views.</i>
superhuman	Above or beyond the human or demanding more than human power or endurance. <i>Superhuman strength.</i>
titanic	Of great force or power. <i>A series of titanic explosions.</i>
<u>unafraid</u>	Feeling no fear or anxiety. <i>She was calm and unafraid.</i>
undaunted	Resolutely courageous. <i>Undaunted in the face of death.</i>
<u>valiant</u>	Possessing or showing courage or determination. <i>She made a valiant effort to hold her anger in check.</i>
valorous	Having or showing valor. <i>Valorous deeds on the field of honour.</i>
venturesome	Willing to take risks or embark on difficult or unusual courses of action. <i>Anyone venturesome enough to try to blaze a trail through it would soon beat a hasty retreat.</i>

- stalwart** A person who is loyal to their allegiance (especially in times of revolt).
*He was of **stalwart** build.*

*A **stouthearted** fellow who had an active career in the army.*
- valiant** Having or showing valor.
*A **valiant** attempt to prevent the hijack.*
- valor** The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle).
*He received a medal for **valor**.*
- valorous** Showing great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle.
***Valorous** deeds on the field of honour.*
- venturous** Disposed to venture or take risks.
*A **venturous** spirit.*
