# Hidden as an Adjective

#### Definitions of "Hidden" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "hidden" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Not accessible to view.
- Difficult to find.
- Kept out of sight; concealed.
- Designed to elude detection.







### Synonyms of "Hidden" as an adjective (13 Words)

**camouflaged** Made invisible by means of protective coloring.

concealed	Kept secret; hidden. A <b>concealed</b> weapon.
<u>covered</u>	Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form. <i>Covered</i> wagons.
disguised	Having its true character concealed with the intent of misleading. Are all of your novels <b>disguised</b> autobiography.
<u>invisible</u>	Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye. <i>Invisible</i> rays.
masked	(of one's true character or feelings) concealed. <i>Masked dancers</i> .
not visible	Obvious to the eye.
<u>obscure</u>	Remote and separate physically or socially. An impulse to go off and fight certain <b>obscure</b> battles of his own spirit.
out of sight	Not allowed to continue to bat or run.
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. The <b>secret</b> compartment in the desk.
unrevealed	Not revealed; secret. Some feelings can run so deep that they are better left <b>unrevealed</b> .
<u>unseen</u>	Not seen or observed. It seemed she might escape <b>unseen</b> .
<u>veiled</u>	Wearing or covered by a veil. A <b>veiled</b> woman.







### Usage Examples of "Hidden" as an adjective

- Hidden valleys.
- A hidden cave.
- Concealed (or hidden) damage.
- Hidden dangers.
- Her hidden feelings.
- A hidden room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.



# Associations of "Hidden" (30 Words)

<u>cache</u>	Store data in a cache memory. <i>He decided that they must <b>cache</b> their weapons.</i>
<u>cave</u>	Hollow out as if making a cave or opening. They say they <b>cave</b> for the adventure challenge and physical exercise.



clandestine	Kept secret or done secretively, especially because illicit. <i>Clandestine intelligence operations</i> .
concealed	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>Concealed</i> or hidden damage.
concealment	The activity of keeping something secret. The <b>concealment</b> of the weapons.
<u>covert</u>	Not openly acknowledged or displayed. <i>Covert</i> actions by the CIA.
<u>crypt</u>	A small tubular gland, pit, or recess.
den	Of a wild animal live in a den. A female mink had set up her <b>den</b> there.
disguised	Concealed or obscured; made unrecognizable. The <b>disguised</b> form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.
<u>furtive</u>	Secret and sly or sordid. They spent a <b>furtive</b> day together.
incognito	With your identity concealed. She is locked in her <b>incognito</b> .
infiltration	Permeation of a liquid into something by filtration. The <b>infiltration</b> of seawater through the lava.
<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>He lounged in a doorway <b>invisible</b> in the dark.</i>
lair	A burial plot in a graveyard. A group of adventurers stormed into his mountain <b>lair</b> and killed him.
operative	(of a word) having the most significance in a phrase or sentence. <i>Wounds needing <b>operative</b> treatment.</i>
<u>secrecy</u>	The trait of keeping things secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b></i> .
secret	Of information given in confidence or in secret. The resupply effort was probably kept <b>secret</b> from Congress.
<u>secretive</u>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. A <b>secretive</b> smile.
sensitization	(psychology) the process of becoming highly sensitive to specific events or situations (especially emotional events or situations. <i>The aim of the activity was to develop</i> <b>sensitization</b> <i>to issues of diversity in</i> <i>the classroom.</i>



<u>sly</u>	Marked by skill in deception. A <b>sly</b> manipulative woman.
<u>sneak</u>	Someone who prowls or sneaks about usually with unlawful intentions. <i>He</i> <b>sneak</b> s up on us slyly.
<u>spy</u>	A secret watcher; someone who secretly watches other people. <b>Spy</b> for the Russians.
<u>stealthy</u>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>Stealthy footsteps</i> .
<u>subterranean</u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed)- Bertrand Russell. <i>The subterranean</i> world of the behind the scenes television power brokers.
surreptitious	Kept secret, especially because it would not be approved of. Low wages were supplemented by <b>surreptitious</b> payments from tradesmen.
<u>ulterior</u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed. <i>Could there be an <b>ulterior</b> motive behind his request.</i>
<u>undercover</u>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>He worked <b>undercover</b> in Northern Ireland.</i>
<u>underground</u>	A member of an underground political group or movement. <b>Underground</b> resistance.
<u>underneath</u>	Partly or wholly concealed by a garment. She seemed to have no emotions but in fact she was very sensitive <b>underneath</b> .
unopened	Not opened. <b>Unopened</b> mail.
