Hidden as an Adjective

Definitions of "Hidden" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hidden” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not accessible to view.*
- *Difficult to find.*
- *Kept out of sight; concealed.*
- *Designed to elude detection.*



Synonyms of "Hidden" as an adjective (13 Words)

camouflaged	Made invisible by means of protective coloring.
concealed	Kept secret; hidden. <i>A concealed weapon.</i>
<u>covered</u>	Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form. <i>Covered wagons.</i>
disguised	Having its true character concealed with the intent of misleading. <i>Are all of your novels disguised autobiography.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye. <i>Invisible rays.</i>
masked	(of one's true character or feelings) concealed. <i>Masked dancers.</i>
not visible	Obvious to the eye.
<u>obscure</u>	Remote and separate physically or socially. <i>An impulse to go off and fight certain obscure battles of his own spirit.</i>
out of sight	Not allowed to continue to bat or run.
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>The secret compartment in the desk.</i>
unrevealed	Not revealed; secret. <i>Some feelings can run so deep that they are better left unrevealed.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	Not seen or observed. <i>It seemed she might escape unseen.</i>
<u>veiled</u>	Wearing or covered by a veil. <i>A veiled woman.</i>



Usage Examples of "Hidden" as an adjective

- *Hidden valleys.*
- *A hidden cave.*
- *Concealed (or hidden) damage.*
- *Hidden dangers.*
- *Her hidden feelings.*
- *A hidden room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.*



Associations of "Hidden" (30 Words)

cache

Store data in a cache memory.

*He decided that they must **cache** their weapons.*

cave

Hollow out as if making a cave or opening.

*They say they **cave** for the adventure challenge and physical exercise.*

clandestine	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i>Clandestine intelligence operations.</i>
concealed	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>Concealed or hidden damage.</i>
concealment	The activity of keeping something secret. <i>The concealment of the weapons.</i>
<u>covert</u>	Not openly acknowledged or displayed. <i>Covert actions by the CIA.</i>
<u>crypt</u>	A small tubular gland, pit, or recess.
den	Of a wild animal live in a den. <i>A female mink had set up her den there.</i>
disguised	Concealed or obscured; made unrecognizable. <i>The disguised form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.</i>
<u>furtive</u>	Secret and sly or sordid. <i>They spent a furtive day together.</i>
incognito	With your identity concealed. <i>She is locked in her incognito.</i>
infiltration	Permeation of a liquid into something by filtration. <i>The infiltration of seawater through the lava.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>He lounged in a doorway invisible in the dark.</i>
lair	A burial plot in a graveyard. <i>A group of adventurers stormed into his mountain lair and killed him.</i>
operative	(of a word) having the most significance in a phrase or sentence. <i>Wounds needing operative treatment.</i>
<u>secrecy</u>	The trait of keeping things secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in secrecy.</i>
secret	Of information given in confidence or in secret. <i>The resupply effort was probably kept secret from Congress.</i>
<u>secretive</u>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. <i>A secretive smile.</i>
sensitization	(psychology) the process of becoming highly sensitive to specific events or situations (especially emotional events or situations). <i>The aim of the activity was to develop sensitization to issues of diversity in the classroom.</i>

<u>sly</u>	Marked by skill in deception. <i>A sly manipulative woman.</i>
<u>sneak</u>	Someone who prowls or sneaks about usually with unlawful intentions. <i>He sneaks up on us slyly.</i>
<u>spy</u>	A secret watcher; someone who secretly watches other people. <i>Spy for the Russians.</i>
<u>stealthy</u>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>Stealthy footsteps.</i>
<u>subterranean</u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed)- Bertrand Russell. <i>The subterranean world of the behind the scenes television power brokers.</i>
<u>surreptitious</u>	Kept secret, especially because it would not be approved of. <i>Low wages were supplemented by surreptitious payments from tradesmen.</i>
<u>ulterior</u>	Lying beyond what is openly revealed or avowed (especially being kept in the background or deliberately concealed). <i>Could there be an ulterior motive behind his request.</i>
<u>undercover</u>	Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods. <i>He worked undercover in Northern Ireland.</i>
<u>underground</u>	A member of an underground political group or movement. <i>Underground resistance.</i>
<u>underneath</u>	Partly or wholly concealed by a garment. <i>She seemed to have no emotions but in fact she was very sensitive underneath.</i>
<u>unopened</u>	Not opened. <i>Unopened mail.</i>
