echelon	Arrange in an echelon formation. <i>The Task Force would take the left echeloned to be able to sweep in from the west.</i>
feudal	Of or relating to or characteristic of feudalism. <i>His view of patriotism was more than old fashioned it was positively feudal.</i>
feudalistic	Of or relating to or characteristic of feudalism.
genteel	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>A genteel old lady.</i>
governmental	Relating to or dealing with the affairs or structure of government or politics or the state. <i>Governmental policy.</i>
hierarchic	Classified according to various criteria into successive levels or layers. <i>In her hierarchic set of values honesty comes first.</i>
hierarchy	The organization of people at different ranks in an administrative body. <i>The magazine was read quite widely even by some of the hierarchy.</i>
humanization	The act of making more human.
imperial	Relating to or associated with an empire. <i>The party and its autocratic many would say imperial ways.</i>

king	A playing card bearing a representation of a king normally ranking next below an ace. <i>Science kings it over the realm of intellectual discourse.</i>
noble	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i>There is nothing more noble than a mature pine forest.</i>
nomenclature	The term or terms applied to someone or something. <i>The students found it hard to decipher the nomenclature of chemical compounds.</i>
organizational	Relating to the action of organizing something. <i>A company's organizational structure.</i>
patrician	A person of refined upbringing and manners. <i>A proud patrician face.</i>
rank	Have a specified rank or place within a grading system. <i>She is ranked number four in the world.</i>
regal	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Her regal bearing.</i>
regency	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i>
society	A specified section of society. <i>He enjoyed the society of his friends.</i>
stratified	(of a society) divided into levels or classes based on social status, education, or income. <i>Warming temperatures can lead to more stratified ocean layers.</i>
system	A method of choosing one's procedure in gambling. <i>They had to devise a system that did not depend on cooperation.</i>
taxonomy	The branch of science concerned with classification, especially of organisms; systematics. <i>A taxonomy of smells.</i>
