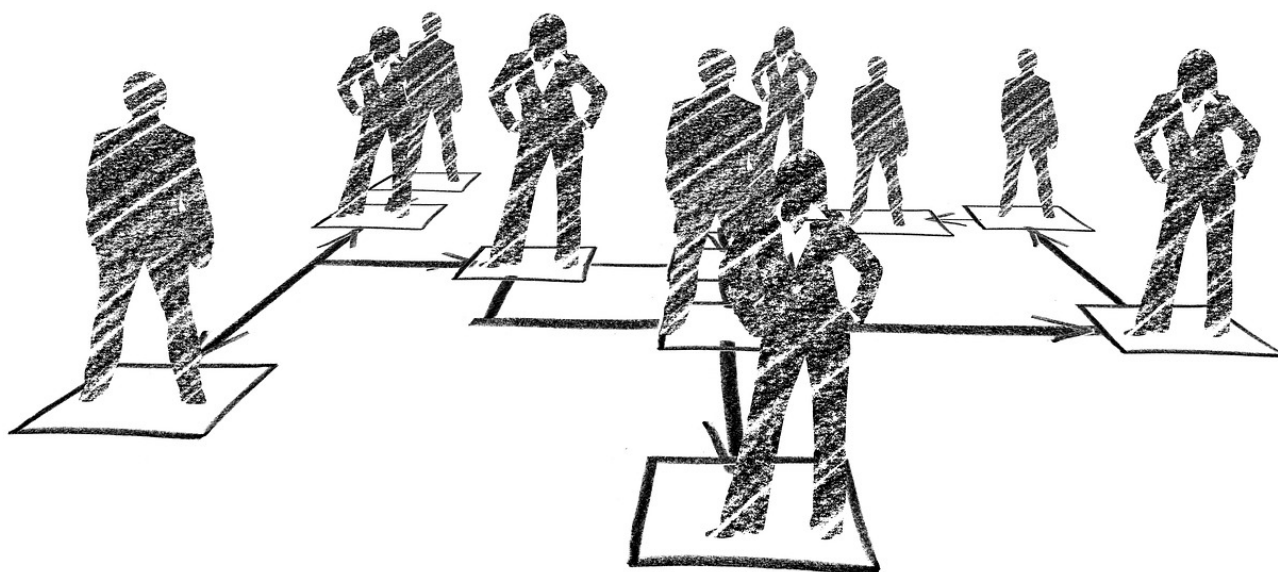

Definitions of "Hierarchy" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hierarchy” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The organization of people at different ranks in an administrative body.*
- *The upper echelons of a hierarchical system.*
- *A system in which members of an organization or society are ranked according to relative status or authority.*
- *A series of ordered groupings of people or things within a system.*
- *An arrangement or classification of things according to relative importance or inclusiveness.*
- *The traditional system of orders of angels and other heavenly beings.*
- *The clergy of the Catholic Church or of an episcopal Church.*



Synonyms of "Hierarchy" as a noun (9 Words)

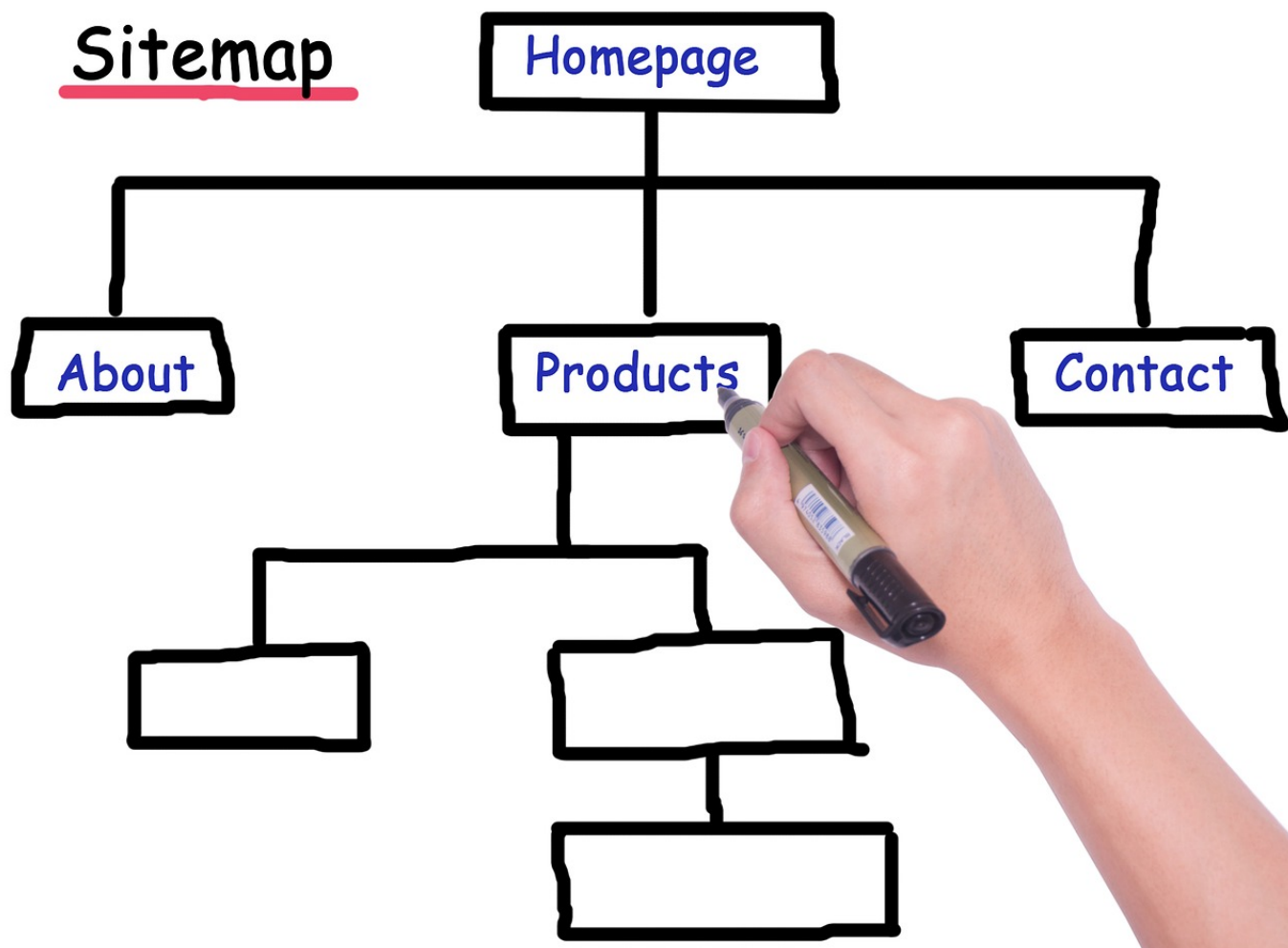
class system	Education imparted in a series of lessons or meetings.
grading	Evaluation of performance by assigning a grade or score. <i>What he disliked about teaching was all the grading he had to do.</i>
ladder	A piece of equipment consisting of a series of bars or steps between two upright lengths of wood, metal, or rope, used for climbing up or down something. <i>He climbed the career ladder.</i>
pecking order	A United States dry measure equal to 8 quarts or 537.605 cubic inches.
power structure	Possession of controlling influence.
ranking	The action or process of giving a specified rank to someone or something. <i>The ranking of students.</i>
social order	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.

social scale	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
social stratum	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.

authoritarian	An authoritarian person. <i>The timid child of authoritarian parents.</i>
<u>autocracy</u>	A political system governed by a single individual. <i>The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy.</i>
bureaucratic	Relating to a system of government in which most of the important decisions are taken by state officials rather than by elected representatives. <i>The scheme is overly bureaucratic and complex.</i>
caste	The system of dividing society into castes. <i>In both ants and termites the workers can include specialist castes such as soldiers.</i>

<u>citizen</u>	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>A British citizen.</i>
<u>civilian</u>	Relating to civilians. <i>I talk to a lot of actresses and they say that civilians are scared of them.</i>
<u>colonialism</u>	The policy or practice of acquiring full or partial political control over another country, occupying it with settlers, and exploiting it economically. <i>The state apparatus that was dominant under colonialism.</i>
<u>country</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The country s largest manufacturer.</i>
demobilize	Retire from military service. <i>Germany demanded that they demobilize within twelve hours.</i>
discrimination	The ability to judge what is of high quality; good judgement or taste. <i>Discrimination learning.</i>
domineering	Tending to domineer. <i>How can I do my job with a domineering boss yelling in my ear.</i>
echelon	Arrange in an echelon formation. <i>The Task Force would take the left echeloned to be able to sweep in from the west.</i>
<u>ethnicity</u>	An ethnic quality or affiliation resulting from racial or cultural ties. <i>Ethnicity has a strong influence on community status relations.</i>
ethnographic	Of or relating to ethnography. <i>Ethnographic research in European border communities.</i>
<u>king</u>	One of the four playing cards in a deck bearing the picture of a king. <i>He ll start kinging it over the lot of us again.</i>
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>A statement that sums up the nation s mood.</i>
<u>national</u>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>A national newspaper.</i>
nationalism	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>Their nationalism is tempered by a desire to join the European Union.</i>
nationality	The status of belonging to a particular nation by birth or naturalization. <i>Such images define their sense of nationality.</i>
oligarchy	A country governed by an oligarchy. <i>The big cities were notoriously in the hands of the oligarchy of local businessmen.</i>
organizational	Of or relating to an organization. <i>The need for organizational change.</i>

<u>patriotism</u>	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>A highly decorated officer of unquestionable integrity and patriotism.</i>
people	Fill with people. <i>She is a favourite of the people.</i>
plutocracy	An elite or ruling class whose power derives from their wealth. <i>Officials were drawn from the new plutocracy.</i>
racism	Discriminatory or abusive behavior towards members of another race. <i>A programme to combat racism.</i>
rank	Assign a rank or rating to. <i>The strike was supported by the union rank and file.</i>
<u>stratified</u>	Deposited or arranged in horizontal layers. <i>Stratified rock.</i>
stratify	Of seeds be germinated by stratifying. <i>The residues have begun to stratify.</i>
system	A set of things working together as parts of a mechanism or an interconnecting network; a complex whole. <i>The body has a system of organs for digestion.</i>
<u>tier</u>	A level or grade within the hierarchy of an organization or system. <i>A three tier wedding cake.</i>
