### Definitions of "Hiking" as a noun

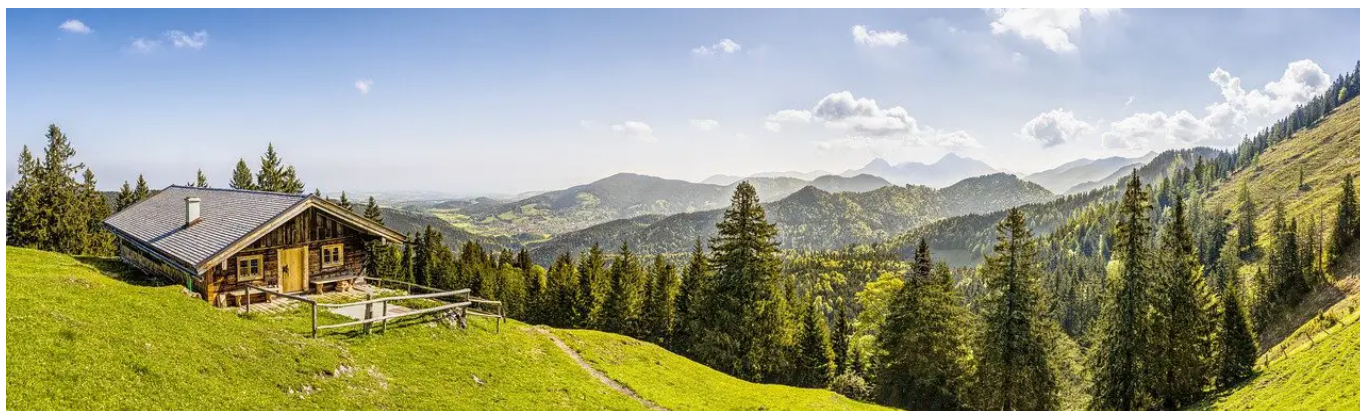
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hiking” as a noun can have the following definitions:

## Associations of "Hiking" (30 Words)

<b>amble</b>	A leisurely walk (usually in some public place). <i>They <b>ambled</b> along the riverbank.</i>
<b>backpack</b>	Hike with a backpack. <i>A week s <b>backpacking</b> in the Pyrenees.</i>
<b>biped</b>	Using two legs for walking.
<b>briskly</b>	In an active, quick, or energetic way. <i>She walked <b>briskly</b> into the building.</i>
<b>camping</b>	The act of encamping and living in tents in a camp. <i>A <b>camping</b> trip.</i>
<b>canter</b>	Ride at a canter. <i>The men <b>cantered</b> away.</i>
<b>climber</b>	An iron spike attached to the shoe to prevent slipping on ice when walking or climbing. <i>The lead <b>climber</b> looked strong still but his partner often slumped in his ropes.</i>

<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b><u>exercise</u></b>	Cause an animal to take exercise. <i>Loosening up <b>exercises</b>.</i>
<b><u>exercising</u></b>	The activity of exerting your muscles in various ways to keep fit. <i>He did some <b>exercising</b>.</i>
<b><u>gait</u></b>	A horse's manner of moving. <i>The easy <b>gait</b> of an athlete.</i>
<b><u>guided</u></b>	Directed by remote control or by internal equipment. <i>A <b>guided</b> missile.</i>
<b><u>hike</u></b>	A long walk usually for exercise or pleasure. <i>The landlord <b>hiked</b> up the rents.</i>
<b><u>jog</u></b>	A spell of jogging. <i>A hand <b>jogged</b> his elbow.</i>
<b><u>jogger</u></b>	Someone who runs a steady slow pace (usually for exercise). <i>Sporty types in <b>joggers</b>.</i>
<b><u>jogging</u></b>	Denoting a garment designed to be worn while jogging. <i><b>Jogging</b> bottoms.</i>
<b><u>jumping</u></b>	The act of jumping propelling yourself off the ground. <i>The <b>jumping</b> was unexpected.</i>
<b><u>knapsack</u></b>	A bag carried by a strap on your back or shoulder.
<b><u>lope</u></b>	Walk or run with a long bounding stride. <i>They set off at a fast <b>lope</b>.</i>
<b><u>picnic</u></b>	Have or take part in a picnic. <i>We swam and went on <b>picnics</b>.</i>
<b><u>quadruped</u></b>	An animal especially a mammal having four limbs specialized for walking. <i>Primitive <b>quadruped</b> simian species.</i>
<b><u>sightseeing</u></b>	Going about to look at places of interest. <i>A <b>sightseeing</b> tour.</i>
<b><u>ski</u></b>	Travel over snow on skis take part in the sport or recreation of skiing. <i>A <b>ski</b> instructor.</i>
<b><u>stroll</u></b>	Walk leisurely and with no apparent aim. <i>I <b>strolled</b> around the city.</i>
<b><u>stroller</u></b>	Someone who walks at a leisurely pace. <i>Shady gardens where <b>strollers</b> could relax.</i>
<b><u>trek</u></b>	A haul of fish caught using a trek net. <i>We spent the summer <b>trekking</b> in the foothills of the Himalayas.</i>

<b>trip</b>	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>He recited the whole poem without a single <b>trip</b>.</i>
<b>walk</b>	Allow or enable a batter to walk. <i>She turned and <b>walked</b> a few paces.</i>
<b>walker</b>	A light enclosing framework (trade name Zimmer) with rubber castors or wheels and handles; helps invalids or the handicapped or the aged to walk. <i>A fell <b>walker</b>.</i>
<b>walking</b>	The act of traveling by foot. <i><b>Walking</b> is a healthy form of exercise.</i>
