Associations of "Hiking" (30 Words)

amble	A leisurely walk (usually in some public place). <i>They ambled along the riverbank.</i>
backpack	Hike with a backpack. <i>A week s backpacking in the Pyrenees.</i>
biped	Using two legs for walking.
briskly	In an active, quick, or energetic way. <i>She walked briskly into the building.</i>
camping	The act of encamping and living in tents in a camp. <i>A camping trip.</i>
canter	Ride at a canter. <i>The men cantered away.</i>
climber	An iron spike attached to the shoe to prevent slipping on ice when walking or climbing. <i>The lead climber looked strong still but his partner often slumped in his ropes.</i>

climbing	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i>
exercise	Cause an animal to take exercise. <i>Loosening up exercises.</i>
exercising	The activity of exerting your muscles in various ways to keep fit. <i>He did some exercising.</i>
gait	A horse's manner of moving. <i>The easy gait of an athlete.</i>
guided	Directed by remote control or by internal equipment. <i>A guided missile.</i>
hike	A long walk usually for exercise or pleasure. <i>The landlord hiked up the rents.</i>
jog	A spell of jogging. <i>A hand jogged his elbow.</i>
jogger	Someone who runs a steady slow pace (usually for exercise). <i>Sporty types in joggers.</i>
jogging	Denoting a garment designed to be worn while jogging. <i>Jogging bottoms.</i>
jumping	The act of jumping propelling yourself off the ground. <i>The jumping was unexpected.</i>
knapsack	A bag carried by a strap on your back or shoulder.
lope	Walk or run with a long bounding stride. <i>They set off at a fast lope.</i>
picnic	Have or take part in a picnic. <i>We swam and went on picnics.</i>
quadruped	An animal especially a mammal having four limbs specialized for walking. <i>Primitive quadruped simian species.</i>
sightseeing	Going about to look at places of interest. <i>A sightseeing tour.</i>
ski	Travel over snow on skis take part in the sport or recreation of skiing. <i>A ski instructor.</i>
stroll	Walk leisurely and with no apparent aim. <i>I strolled around the city.</i>
stroller	Someone who walks at a leisurely pace. <i>Shady gardens where strollers could relax.</i>
trek	A haul of fish caught using a trek net. <i>We spent the summer trekking in the foothills of the Himalayas.</i>

trip

Make a trip for pleasure.

*He recited the whole poem without a single **trip**.*

walk

Allow or enable a batter to walk.

*She turned and **walked** a few paces.*

walker

A light enclosing framework (trade name Zimmer) with rubber castors or wheels and handles; helps invalids or the handicapped or the aged to walk.

*A fell **walker**.*

walking

The act of traveling by foot.

***Walking** is a healthy form of exercise.*
