She sounded in a **iocular** mood.

Happy and cheerful. jolly

We had a very **jolly** time.

Cheerful and friendly. **jovial** She was in a **jovial** mood.

Offering fun and gaiety.

merry After the third beer he began to feel quite **merry**.

Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. mirthful

A mirthful laugh.

Full of or characterized by loud and nonmusical sounds. **noisy**

The pub was crowded and **noisy**.

Hilariously funny. riotous

Riotous times.

Noisy and disorderly. rowdy

It was a **rowdy** but good natured crowd.

Giving a long, loud, piercing cry or cries.

screaming In **screaming** agony.

(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. **sparkling**

Sparkling wines.

Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. uproarious

An **uproarious** party.

very funny Being the exact same one; not any other.


Vigorous and animated. vivacious
