- *The exterior angle formed by the junction of a sloping side and a sloping end of a roof.*
- *(architecture) the exterior angle formed by the junction of a sloping side and a sloping end of a roof.*
- *The fruit of a rose plant.*
- *The structure of the vertebrate skeleton supporting the lower limbs in humans and the hind limbs or corresponding parts in other vertebrates.*

- *The sharp edge of a roof from the ridge to the eaves where the two sides meet.*

pelvic arch	A curved bony structure supporting or enclosing organs (especially the inner sides of the feet).
pelvic girdle	The structure of the vertebrate skeleton supporting the lower limbs in humans and the hind limbs or corresponding parts in other vertebrates.
pelvis	The part of the abdomen including or enclosed by the pelvis.
posterior	A person's buttocks.

rear	The side that goes last or is not normally seen. <i>Infantrymen were in the rear.</i>
rose hip	Any of many shrubs of the genus <i>Rosa</i> that bear roses.
rosehip	The fruit of a rose plant.
thighs	The upper joint of the leg of a fowl.

ankle	The narrow part of the leg between the ankle joint and the calf. <i>We can ankle off to a new locale.</i>
arm	A sleeve of a garment. <i>The political arm of the separatist group.</i>
belt	A conveyor belt. <i>A belt of trees.</i>
buckle	Fasten with a buckle or buckles. <i>He buckled his belt.</i>
cartilage	A particular structure made of cartilage. <i>His knees failed and the cartilages were removed.</i>
chest	Propel the ball by means of one's chest. <i>The medicine chest.</i>
cleavage	Cell division, especially of a fertilized egg cell. <i>All the cells divide synchronously for the first 12 cleavages.</i>
dislocate	Disturb the organization of; disrupt. <i>He dislocated his shoulder in training.</i>
elbow	Shove one's elbow into another person's ribs. <i>He elbowed his way through the crush.</i>
epaulet	Adornment consisting of an ornamental cloth pad worn on the shoulder.
extensor	A muscle whose contraction extends or straightens a limb or other part of the body.
fracture	A diphthong substituted by fracture. <i>A fracture of the left leg.</i>
garter	Fasten with or as if with a garter. <i>She leaned back showing the garter on her thigh.</i>
holster	Put a gun into its holster. <i>He holstered the Browning before walking back.</i>
jaw	The lower movable bone of the jaw or the part of the face containing it. <i>He jawed his bubble gum.</i>
knee	The joint in other animals that corresponds or is analogous to the human knee. <i>She kneed him in the groin.</i>
kneecap	Shoot in the kneecap often done by terrorist groups as a warning. <i>Petty crimes are punished by kneecapping.</i>
lap	A flap that lies over another part. <i>The cat lapped up the milk.</i>

- ligament** A sheet or band of tough fibrous tissue connecting bones or cartilages or supporting muscles or organs.
- limb** The circumferential edge of the apparent disc of the sun or the moon or a planet.
*The upper **limb** of the bow.*
- mandible** Either half of the crushing organ in an arthropod's mouthparts.
*The drake is all black except for an orange mark on the upper **mandible**.*
- neck** The length of a horse's head and neck as a measure of its lead in a race.
*He'll be stuck with a loan around his **neck**.*
- sash** A framework that holds the panes of a window in the window frame.
- shoulder** A part of something resembling a shoulder in shape position or function.
*She **shouldered** him brusquely aside.*
- sleeve** Small case into which an object fits.
*An album **sleeve**.*
- sprain** Twist suddenly so as to sprain.
*He left in a wheelchair after **spraining** an ankle.*
- waist** The circumference of a person's waist.
*Her **waist** has reduced from 35 to 28 inches.*
- waistline** An imaginary line around a car or other vehicle at the level of the bottom of the windows.
*The changing **waistline** in women's fashions.*
- wrist** The part of a garment covering the wrist a cuff.
*Elasticated **wrists** and ankles.*
