## Associations of "Hit it off" (30 Words)

<b>abolish</b>	Formally put an end to (a system, practice, or institution). <i>The tax was <b>abolished</b> in 1977.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<b><a href="#">annihilate</a></b>	Convert (a subatomic particle) into radiant energy. <i>A crusade to <b>annihilate</b> evil.</i>
<b>annul</b>	Declare (a marriage) to have had no legal existence. <i>Her first marriage was finally <b>annulled</b> by His Holiness.</i>
<b>assault</b>	The crime of forcing a person to submit to sexual intercourse against his or her will. <i>A sexual <b>assault</b>.</i>
<b>belabor</b>	Attack verbally with harsh criticism. <i>She was <b>belabored</b> by her fellow students.</i>
<b><a href="#">bump</a></b>	In a race gain a bump against. <i>She <b>bumped</b> the girl with her hip.</i>
<b><a href="#">cancel</a></b>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>A <b>cancel</b> title page.</i>
<b>clash</b>	A state of conflict between colors. <i>We <b>clashed</b> over the new farm policies.</i>
<b>collide</b>	Cause to collide. <i>In his work politics and metaphysics <b>collide</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">collision</a></b>	A brief event in which two or more bodies come together. <i>His car was in <b>collision</b> with a lorry.</i>
<b>crash</b>	Move with or as if with a crashing noise. <i>A racing car had <b>crashed</b> wrecking a safety barrier.</i>
<b><a href="#">delete</a></b>	Remove (a product, especially a recording) from the catalogue of those available for purchase. <i>Their EMI release has already been <b>deleted</b>.</i>

<b>demolish</b>	Defeat soundly and humiliatingly. <i>The teenagers <b>demolished</b> four pizzas among them.</i>
<b>destroy</b>	Destroy completely damage irreparably. <i>The fire <b>destroyed</b> the house.</i>
<b>eliminate</b>	Eliminate from the body. <i>The police have <b>eliminated</b> Lawrence from their inquiries.</i>
<b>iconoclasm</b>	The orientation of an iconoclast.
<b>lambaste</b>	Beat with a cane.
<b>nullify</b>	Show to be invalid. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.</i>
<b>override</b>	Travel or move over. <i>The House vote in favour of the bill was 10 votes short of the requisite majority for an <b>override</b>.</i>
<b>raze</b>	Tear down so as to make flat with the ground. <i>Villages were <b>razed</b> to the ground.</i>
<b>reject</b>	Reject with contempt. <i>An application to hold a pop concert at the club was <b>rejected</b>.</i>
<b>reproach</b>	In the Roman Catholic Church a set of antiphons and responses for Good Friday representing the reproaches of Christ to his people. <i>He gave her a look of <b>reproach</b>.</i>
<b>repudiation</b>	The exposure of falseness or pretensions. <i>A <b>repudiation</b> of left wing political ideas.</i>
<b>revoke</b>	Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise). <i>He <b>revoked</b> the ban on smoking.</i>
<b>slap</b>	Hit against or into something with the sound of something being slapped. <i>He gave her a <b>slap</b> across her cheek.</i>
<b>smash</b>	An act or sound of something smashing. <i>Donald <b>smashed</b> him over the head.</i>
<b>strike</b>	A pitch that passes through the strike zone. <i>Photoengravers voted to <b>strike</b> the New York Times.</i>
<b>vie</b>	Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something. <i>The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.</i>
<b>withdrawal</b>	Avoiding emotional involvement. <i>Italy's <b>withdrawal</b> from NATO.</i>
