Associations of "Hit it off" (30 Words)

abolish	Formally put an end to (a system, practice, or institution). <i>The tax was abolished in 1977.</i>
abrogation	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
annihilate	Convert (a subatomic particle) into radiant energy. <i>A crusade to annihilate evil.</i>
annul	Declare (a marriage) to have had no legal existence. <i>Her first marriage was finally annulled by His Holiness.</i>
assault	The crime of forcing a person to submit to sexual intercourse against his or her will. <i>A sexual assault.</i>
belabor	Attack verbally with harsh criticism. <i>She was belabored by her fellow students.</i>
bump	In a race gain a bump against. <i>She bumped the girl with her hip.</i>
cancel	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>A cancel title page.</i>
clash	A state of conflict between colors. <i>We clashed over the new farm policies.</i>
collide	Cause to collide. <i>In his work politics and metaphysics collide.</i>
collision	A brief event in which two or more bodies come together. <i>His car was in collision with a lorry.</i>
crash	Move with or as if with a crashing noise. <i>A racing car had crashed wrecking a safety barrier.</i>
delete	Remove (a product, especially a recording) from the catalogue of those available for purchase. <i>Their EMI release has already been deleted.</i>

demolish	Defeat soundly and humiliatingly. <i>The teenagers demolished four pizzas among them.</i>
destroy	Destroy completely damage irreparably. <i>The fire destroyed the house.</i>
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. <i>The police have eliminated Lawrence from their inquiries.</i>
iconoclasm	The orientation of an iconoclast.
lambaste	Beat with a cane.
nullify	Show to be invalid. <i>Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby nullify the effects of training.</i>
override	Travel or move over. <i>The House vote in favour of the bill was 10 votes short of the requisite majority for an override.</i>
raze	Tear down so as to make flat with the ground. <i>Villages were razed to the ground.</i>
reject	Reject with contempt. <i>An application to hold a pop concert at the club was rejected.</i>
reproach	In the Roman Catholic Church a set of antiphons and responses for Good Friday representing the reproaches of Christ to his people. <i>He gave her a look of reproach.</i>
repudiation	The exposure of falseness or pretensions. <i>A repudiation of left wing political ideas.</i>
revoke	Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise). <i>He revoked the ban on smoking.</i>
slap	Hit against or into something with the sound of something being slapped. <i>He gave her a slap across her cheek.</i>
smash	An act or sound of something smashing. <i>Donald smashed him over the head.</i>
strike	A pitch that passes through the strike zone. <i>Photoengravers voted to strike the New York Times.</i>
vie	Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something. <i>The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.</i>
withdrawal	Avoiding emotional involvement. <i>Italy's withdrawal from NATO.</i>
