<b>hobbyhorse</b>	A child's plaything consisting of an imitation horse mounted on rockers; the child straddles it and pretends to ride. <i>Don't get him started on his <b>hobbyhorse</b>.</i>
<b>pursuit</b>	A cycling race in which competitors set off from different parts of a track and attempt to overtake one another. <i>The cat crouched in the grass in <b>pursuit</b> of a bird.</i>
<b>rocking horse</b>	Hard bright-colored stick candy (typically flavored with peppermint).
<b>sideline</b>	The area immediately outside either sideline as a place for non players substitutes or spectators. <i>Gascoigne celebrated his goal by sprinting to the <b>sidelines</b>.</i>
<b>spare-time activity</b>	The capacity of a substance to take part in a chemical reaction.
