pursuit	A cycling race in which competitors set off from different parts of a track and attempt to overtake one another. <i>The cat crouched in the grass in pursuit of a bird.</i>
rocking horse	Hard bright-colored stick candy (typically flavored with peppermint).
sideline	The area immediately outside either sideline as a place for non players substitutes or spectators. <i>Gascoigne celebrated his goal by sprinting to the sidelines.</i>
spare-time activity	The capacity of a substance to take part in a chemical reaction.

bagatelle	A thing regarded as too unimportant or easy to be worth much consideration. <i>Dealing with these boats was a mere bagatelle for the world's oldest yacht club.</i>
basketball	The inflated ball used in basketball.
bingo	A game in which players mark off numbers on cards as the numbers are drawn randomly by a caller, the winner being the first person to mark off all their numbers. <i>A bingo hall.</i>

bonanza	An especially rich vein of precious ore. <i>A natural gas bonanza for Britain.</i>
boxing	The enclosure of something in a package or box.
championship	The position or title of the winner of a championship contest. <i>The world chess championship.</i>
chess	A board game for two players who move their 16 pieces according to specific rules; the object is to checkmate the opponent's king.
collector	A person who is employed to collect payments (as for rent or taxes). <i>The ticket collector closed the gates.</i>
dice	Play or gamble with dice. <i>He d better behave or I ll dice him.</i>
entertainment	An event, performance, or activity designed to entertain others. <i>Everyone just sits in front of the television for entertainment.</i>
gambling	The act of playing for stakes in the hope of winning (including the payment of a price for a chance to win a prize). <i>His gambling cost him a fortune.</i>
interest	Excite the curiosity of engage the interest of. <i>They said nothing of great interest.</i>
intrigue	Form intrigues for in an underhand manner. <i>Within the region s borders is a wealth of interest and intrigue.</i>
leisure	Use of free time for enjoyment. <i>His job left him little leisure.</i>
marvel	Be amazed at. <i>We marvelled at the child s linguistic abilities.</i>
numismatist	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
pastime	A diversion that occupies one's time and thoughts (usually pleasantly). <i>Sailing is her favorite pastime.</i>
pentathlon	An athletic event comprising five different events for each competitor in particular also modern pentathlon an event involving fencing shooting swimming riding and cross country running.
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
play	Make a disc music player or other device produce sounds or recorded images. <i>They played games on their opponents.</i>
pursuit	A diversion that occupies one's time and thoughts (usually pleasantly). <i>The cat crouched in the grass in pursuit of a bird.</i>

- winning** Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition.
