pursuitThe action of the eye in following a moving object.

A whole range of leisure **pursuit**s.

rocking horse A lump or mass of hard consolidated mineral matter.

The area immediately outside either sideline as a place for non

sideline players substitutes or spectators.

Electronic handbooks are a lucrative **sideline** for the firm.


spare-time activity A process existing in or produced by nature (rather than by the intent of human beings.
