### caregiver

A family member or paid helper who regularly looks after a child or a sick, elderly, or disabled person.

### chore

A specific piece of work required to be done as a duty or for a specific fee.  
*The early risers were up and about doing their **chores**.*

### **contracted**

Reduced in size or pulled together.  
*The **contracted** pupils of her eyes.*

### **contractor**

A party to a contract.  
*The school meals service is provided by private **contractors**.*

### daughter

A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source.  
*The heptathlete could become one of Yorkshire's most famous **daughters**.*

### dole

A person's lot or destiny.  
*The customary **dole** was a tumblerful of rice.*

<b>employ</b>	The state of being employed for wages or a salary. <i>I started work in the <b>employ</b> of a grocer.</i>
<b>employee</b>	A worker who is hired to perform a job.
<b>errand</b>	The purpose or object of an errand. <i>She knew that if she stated her <b>errand</b> she would not be able to see him.</i>
<b>father</b>	Treat with the protective care associated with a father. <i>He <b>fathered</b> three children.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A savage who cuts off and preserves the heads of enemies as trophies. <i>A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>hire</b>	A newly hired employee. <i>New <b>hires</b> go through six months of training.</i>
<b>househusband</b>	A husband who keeps house while his wife earns the family income.
<b>housekeeping</b>	Money set aside or given for running a household. <i>Writing barely pays my part of the <b>housekeeping</b>.</i>
<b>idle</b>	Be idle exist in a changeless situation. <i><b>Idle</b> carpenters.</i>
<b>laborer</b>	Someone who works with their hands; someone engaged in manual labor.
<b>mother</b>	A term of address for a mother superior. <i>The initiatives were based on the experience of the <b>mother</b> company.</i>
<b>plodder</b>	A person who works in a slow and persevering but uninspired manner. <i>I am more of a <b>plodder</b> than a hiker.</i>
<b>profession</b>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>His chosen <b>profession</b> of teaching.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	Belonging to or characteristic of the proletariat. <i>They are true <b>proletarians</b>.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	An official who enlists personnel for military service. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The incorporation of cells from elsewhere in the body into a tissue or region. <i>Methods of military <b>recruitment</b>.</i>
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i><b>Semiskilled</b> dockworkers.</i>
<b>son</b>	The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus. <i>The <b>sons</b> of Adam.</i>
<b>subcontractor</b>	A firm or person that carries out work for a company as part of a larger project.

<b><u>unemployed</u></b>	(of a person) without a paid job but available to work. <i>You have to put your left foot under the clutch when it is <b>unemployed</b>.</i>
<b>vocation</b>	A body of people doing the same kind of work. <i>GNVQs in Leisure and Tourism will be the introduction to a wide span of <b>vocations</b>.</i>
<b>workaholic</b>	Person with a compulsive need to work.
<b>worker</b>	A person who works at a specific occupation. <i>He is a good <b>worker</b>.</i>
<b><u>workforce</u></b>	The people engaged in or available for work, either in a country or area or in a particular firm or industry. <i>A quarter of Galway's manufacturing <b>workforce</b> are being put out of a job.</i>
