## Associations of "Homeostasis" (30 Words)

<b>aerobic</b>	Based on or using the principles of aerobics enhancing respiratory and circulatory efficiency. <i>Simple <b>aerobic</b> bacteria.</i>
<b>blood</b>	The fluid red in vertebrates that is pumped through the body by the heart and contains plasma blood cells and platelets. <i><b>Blood</b> carries oxygen and nutrients to the tissues and carries away waste products.</i>
<b>bloodstream</b>	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
<b>carbohydrate</b>	Food consisting of or containing a lot of carbohydrates. <i>Water soluble <b>carbohydrates</b>.</i>
<b>cardiovascular</b>	Of or pertaining to or involving the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from <b>cardiovascular</b> disease.</i>
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<b>cortex</b>	The outer layer of the cerebrum the cerebral cortex composed of folded grey matter and playing an important role in consciousness.
<b>diabetes</b>	A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.
<b>diabetic</b>	Having diabetes. <i>A <b>diabetic</b> diet.</i>
<b>digestion</b>	The process of treating a substance with heat, enzymes, or a solvent to promote decomposition or extract essential components. <i>He suffered with his <b>digestion</b>.</i>
<b>enzyme</b>	A substance produced by a living organism which acts as a catalyst to bring about a specific biochemical reaction.
<b>glucose</b>	A syrup containing glucose and other sugars made by hydrolysis of starch and used in the food industry.

<b>glycogen</b>	A substance deposited in bodily tissues as a store of carbohydrates. It is a polysaccharide which forms glucose on hydrolysis.
<b>hypertension</b>	A state of great psychological stress.
<b>hypoglycemia</b>	Abnormally low blood sugar usually resulting from excessive insulin or a poor diet.
<b>insulin</b>	A hormone produced in the pancreas by the islets of Langerhans which regulates the amount of glucose in the blood The lack of insulin causes a form of diabetes.
<b>intercellular</b>	Located or occurring between cells. <i>Intercellular spaces.</i>
<b>lymphatic</b>	Of or relating to or produced by lymph. <i>The fluid is drained by the <b>lymphatics</b> and returned to the circulation.</i>
<b>metabolism</b>	The chemical processes that occur within a living organism in order to maintain life. <i>The <b>metabolism</b> of fatty acids in the kidney.</i>
<b>phenylalanine</b>	An amino acid widely distributed in plant proteins. It is an essential nutrient in the diet of vertebrates.
<b>phloem</b>	Tissue that conducts synthesized food substances (e.g., from leaves) to parts where needed; consists primarily of sieve tubes.
<b>plasma</b>	A fourth state of matter distinct from solid or liquid or gas and present in stars and fusion reactors a gas becomes a plasma when it is heated until the atoms lose all their electrons leaving a highly electrified. <i>Particles in space exist in the form of a <b>plasma</b>.</i>
<b>portal</b>	A website or web page providing access or links to other sites. <i>The <b>portals</b> of the cathedral.</i>
<b>protein</b>	Proteins collectively especially as a dietary component. <i>A <b>protein</b> found in wheat.</i>
<b>respiratory</b>	Pertaining to respiration. <i><b>Respiratory</b> disease.</i>
<b>sepsis</b>	A serious condition resulting from the presence of harmful microorganisms in the blood or other tissues and the body's response to their presence, potentially leading to the malfunctioning of various organs, shock, and death.
<b>starch</b>	Powder or spray made from starch and used before ironing to stiffen fabric or clothing. <i>The <b>starch</b> in her voice.</i>

<b><u>therapy</u></b>	(medicine) the act of caring for someone (as by medication or remedial training etc. <b><i>Therapy</i></b> sessions.
<b>vein</b>	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>He felt the adrenaline course through his <b>veins</b>.</i>
<b>venous</b>	Relating to a vein or the veins.
