admirable	Arousing or deserving respect and approval. <i>His taste was impeccable his health admirable.</i>
advert	An advertisement.
aforementioned	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. <i>Songs from the aforementioned album.</i>
aforesaid	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
allude	(of an artist or a work of art) recall (an earlier work or style) in such a way as to suggest a relationship with it. <i>The photographs allude to Italian Baroque painting.</i>
allusion	The practice of making allusions. <i>An allusion to Shakespeare.</i>
ascribe	Regard something as being due to (a cause). <i>He ascribed Jane s short temper to her upset stomach.</i>
citation	A reference to a previous case, used as guidance in the trying of comparable cases or in support of an argument. <i>The citation described him as an officer of extreme gallantry.</i>
cite	A short note recognizing a source of information or of a quoted passage. <i>He does not cite any source for this assertion.</i>
creditable	(of a performance, effort, or action) deserving public acknowledgement and praise but not necessarily outstanding or successful. <i>A very creditable 2 4 defeat.</i>
declaim	Speak against in an impassioned manner. <i>An opportunity to declaim against the evils of society.</i>
enunciation	The articulation of speech regarded from the point of view of its intelligibility to the audience.
estimable	Deserving of respect or high regard. <i>Estimable assets.</i>

fame	Favorable public reputation. <i>Winning the Olympic title has brought her fame and fortune.</i>
famous	Excellent. <i>A famous star.</i>
foregoing	Especially of writing or speech; going before. <i>The foregoing analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
gratefully	In a thankful manner; with thanks. <i>Your financial support is gratefully acknowledged.</i>
impute	Assign (a value) to something by inference from the value of the products or processes to which it contributes. <i>The teacher imputed the student's failure to his nervousness.</i>
notation	A note or annotation. <i>He added a short notation to the address on the envelope.</i>
note	A written sign representing the pitch and duration of a musical note. <i>The Secretariat sent a diplomatic note to the embassy protesting about the sale of arms.</i>
ostensive	Manifestly demonstrative.
quote	Put quote marks around. <i>He quoted from the scriptures.</i>
refer	Make reference to. <i>Refer to your notes.</i>
reference	The relation between a word or phrase and the object or idea it refers to. <i>Each chapter should have references to books covering the subject in greater depth.</i>
remark	A written or spoken comment. <i>He remarked the man's inflamed eyelids.</i>
reputable	Having a good reputation. <i>A reputable wine.</i>
repute	Look on as or consider. <i>The waters of the fountain are reputed to have healing properties.</i>
respectable	Of some merit or importance. <i>America's GDP grew by a respectable 2.6 per cent.</i>
respected	Deeply admired or esteemed. <i>A respected academic.</i>
statement	A nonverbal message. <i>She accessorized with a dazzling orange scarf and a statement necklace.</i>
