ruffian A cruel and brutal fellow.



Someone who learned to fight in the streets rather than being formally

tough trained in the sport of boxing.

A gang of **tough**s.

troublemaker A person who habitually causes difficulty or problems, especially by inciting

others to defy those in authority.

A member of a Germanic people that ravaged Gaul, Spain, Rome (455), and


vandal North Africa in the 4th-5th centuries.

yob A rude, noisy, and aggressive young person.
