## Synonyms of "Horde" as a noun (21 Words)

### army

The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.

An **army** of photographers.

### **bevy**

A flock of birds (especially when gathered close together on the ground).

A **bevy** of big name cameos will keep the adults entertained.

### body

A woman's close fitting stretch garment for the upper body fastening at the crotch.

He was just after her **body**.

### **company**

An institution created to conduct business.

The room was a mess because he hadn't expected **company**.

### crew

An informal body of friends.

A graffiti **crew** called the Syndicate.

### **crowd**

A large number of things or people considered together.

A match marred by **crowd** trouble.

<u>drove</u>	A group of animals (a herd or flock) moving together.
<u>gang</u>	An association of criminals. <i><b>Gang</b> warfare.</i>
<b>group</b>	A combination of atoms having a recognizable identity in a number of compounds. <i>I've always been a fan of the guitarists in the <b>group</b>.</i>
<u>host</u>	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>Atlanta was chosen to be <b>host</b> for the Olympic Games.</i>
<b>large group</b>	A garment size for a large person.
<u>legion</u>	A large military unit. <i><b>Legions</b> of photographers and TV cameras.</i>
<u>mass</u>	The celebration of the Eucharist. <i>Separate the warriors from the <b>mass</b>.</i>
<b>mob</b>	A flock or herd of animals. <i>A <b>mob</b> of cattle.</i>
<u>pack</u>	A quantity of fish fruit or other foods packed or canned in a particular season. <i>A <b>pack</b> of thieves.</i>
<b>party</b>	A person involved in legal proceedings. <i>She joined the <b>party</b> after dinner.</i>
<b>posse</b>	A group of young people who socialize together, especially to go to clubs or raves. <i>Tea was handed round by a <b>posse</b> of mothers.</i>
<u>swarm</u>	A large number of minor celestial objects occurring together in space, especially a dense shower of meteors. <i>A <b>swarm</b> of journalists.</i>
<b>troop</b>	Soldiers or armed forces. <i>A <b>troop</b> of musicians.</i>
<b>troupe</b>	Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical). <i>A <b>troupe</b> of singers.</i>
<b>working party</b>	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked.

## Associations of "Horde" (30 Words)

<b>abundance</b>	The state or condition of having a copious quantity of something; plentifulness. <i>The tropical island boasts an <b>abundance</b> of wildlife.</i>
<b>apiary</b>	A shed containing a number of beehives.
<b>battalion</b>	A large indefinite number. <i>A <b>battalion</b> of ants.</i>
<b>bevy</b>	A flock of birds (especially when gathered close together on the ground). <i>He was surrounded by a <b>bevy</b> of beauties in bathing attire.</i>

<b>brigade</b>	Form or unite into a brigade. <i>A volunteer ambulance <b>brigade</b>.</i>
<b>centurion</b>	The commander of a century in the ancient Roman army.
<b>cohort</b>	A company of companions or supporters. <i>The 1940 4 birth <b>cohort</b> of women.</i>
<b>commander</b>	A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain. <i>The <b>commander</b> of a paratroop regiment.</i>
<b>commando</b>	A unit of commandos. <i>A <b>commando</b> attack.</i>
<b>crowd</b>	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>They <b>crowded</b> into the cockpit.</i>
<b>deploy</b>	(of troops) move into position for military action. <i>The air force began to <b>deploy</b> forward.</i>
<b>diversity</b>	The condition or result of being changeable. <i>There was considerable <b>diversity</b> in the style of the reports.</i>
<b>flea</b>	A small wingless jumping insect which feeds on the blood of mammals and birds. It sometimes transmits diseases through its bite, including plague and myxomatosis.
<b>grenadier</b>	A reddish-brown African waxbill with a red bill and a bright blue rump.
<b>hive</b>	Gather into a hive. <i>The beekeeper <b>hived</b> the swarm.</i>
<b>infest</b>	Invade in great numbers. <i>The roaches <b>infested</b> our kitchen.</i>
<b>infestation</b>	A swarm of insects that attack plants. <i>Efforts were made to deal with an <b>infestation</b> of rats in the building.</i>
<b>legion</b>	A vast number of people or things. <i>Her fans are <b>legion</b>.</i>
<b>lot</b>	Divide into lots as of land for example. <i>He will need a second <b>lot</b> of tills to handle the second currency.</i>
<b>mosquito</b>	Two-winged insect whose female has a long proboscis to pierce the skin and suck the blood of humans and animals.
<b>multitude</b>	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on <b>numerous</b> occasions.</i>



<b>overrun</b>	An instance of something exceeding an expected or allowed time or cost. <i>He allowed the match to <b>overrun</b> by 2 minutes.</i>
<b>parasitic</b>	Of plants or persons; having the nature or habits of a parasite or leech; living off another. <i>Mortality from <b>parasitic</b> diseases.</i>
<u><b>plurality</b></u>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>A <b>plurality</b> of religions.</i>
<u><b>swarm</b></u>	Of flying insects move in or form a swarm. <i>The bees had <b>swarmed</b> and left the hive.</i>
<u><b>tank</b></u>	As much as a tank will hold. <i>Rangers <b>tanked</b> the local side 8 0.</i>
<b>teem</b>	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>The plaza is <b>teeming</b> with undercover policemen.</i>
<b>tribune</b>	A Roman legionary officer.
<u><b>vermin</b></u>	Any of various small animals or insects that are pests; e.g. cockroaches or rats. <i>His clothes are infested with <b>vermin</b>.</i>
