The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.

An **army** of photographers.

bevy

A flock of birds (especially when gathered close together on the ground).

A **bevy** of big name cameos will keep the adults entertained.

[body](#)

A woman's close fitting stretch garment for the upper body fastening at the crotch.

He was just after her **body**.

company

An institution created to conduct business.

The room was a mess because he hadn't expected **company**.

An informal body of friends.

A graffiti **crew** called the Syndicate.

crowd

A large number of things or people considered together.

A match marred by **crowd** trouble.

<u>drove</u>	A group of animals (a herd or flock) moving together.
<u>gang</u>	An association of criminals. <i>Gang warfare.</i>
group	A combination of atoms having a recognizable identity in a number of compounds. <i>I've always been a fan of the guitarists in the group.</i>
<u>host</u>	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>Atlanta was chosen to be host for the Olympic Games.</i>
large group	A garment size for a large person.
<u>legion</u>	A large military unit. <i>Legions of photographers and TV cameras.</i>
<u>mass</u>	The celebration of the Eucharist. <i>Separate the warriors from the mass.</i>
mob	A flock or herd of animals. <i>A mob of cattle.</i>
<u>pack</u>	A quantity of fish fruit or other foods packed or canned in a particular season. <i>A pack of thieves.</i>
party	A person involved in legal proceedings. <i>She joined the party after dinner.</i>
posse	A group of young people who socialize together, especially to go to clubs or raves. <i>Tea was handed round by a posse of mothers.</i>
<u>swarm</u>	A large number of minor celestial objects occurring together in space, especially a dense shower of meteors. <i>A swarm of journalists.</i>
troop	Soldiers or armed forces. <i>A troop of musicians.</i>
troupe	Organization of performers and associated personnel (especially theatrical). <i>A troupe of singers.</i>
working party	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked.

abundance	The state or condition of having a copious quantity of something; plentifulness. <i>The tropical island boasts an abundance of wildlife.</i>
apiary	A shed containing a number of beehives.
battalion	A large indefinite number. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>
bevy	A flock of birds (especially when gathered close together on the ground). <i>He was surrounded by a bevy of beauties in bathing attire.</i>

brigade	Form or unite into a brigade. <i>A volunteer ambulance brigade.</i>
centurion	The commander of a century in the ancient Roman army.
cohort	A company of companions or supporters. <i>The 1940 4 birth cohort of women.</i>
commander	A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain. <i>The commander of a paratroop regiment.</i>
commando	A unit of commandos. <i>A commando attack.</i>
crowd	Cause to herd drive or crowd together. <i>They crowded into the cockpit.</i>
deploy	(of troops) move into position for military action. <i>The air force began to deploy forward.</i>
diversity	The condition or result of being changeable. <i>There was considerable diversity in the style of the reports.</i>
flea	A small wingless jumping insect which feeds on the blood of mammals and birds. It sometimes transmits diseases through its bite, including plague and myxomatosis.
grenadier	A reddish-brown African waxbill with a red bill and a bright blue rump.
hive	Gather into a hive. <i>The beekeeper hived the swarm.</i>
infest	Invade in great numbers. <i>The roaches infested our kitchen.</i>
infestation	A swarm of insects that attack plants. <i>Efforts were made to deal with an infestation of rats in the building.</i>
legion	A vast number of people or things. <i>Her fans are legion.</i>
lot	Divide into lots as of land for example. <i>He will need a second lot of tills to handle the second currency.</i>
mosquito	Two-winged insect whose female has a long proboscis to pierce the skin and suck the blood of humans and animals.
multitude	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the multitude.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on numerous occasions.</i>

overrun	An instance of something exceeding an expected or allowed time or cost. <i>He allowed the match to overrun by 2 minutes.</i>
parasitic	Of plants or persons; having the nature or habits of a parasite or leech; living off another. <i>Mortality from parasitic diseases.</i>
<u>plurality</u>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>A plurality of religions.</i>
<u>swarm</u>	Of flying insects move in or form a swarm. <i>The bees had swarmed and left the hive.</i>
<u>tank</u>	As much as a tank will hold. <i>Rangers tanked the local side 8 0.</i>
teem	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>The plaza is teeming with undercover policemen.</i>
tribune	A Roman legionary officer.
<u>vermin</u>	Any of various small animals or insects that are pests; e.g. cockroaches or rats. <i>His clothes are infested with vermin.</i>
