- The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth.
- The limit of a person's knowledge, experience, or interest.
- A great circle of the celestial sphere, the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place.
- A layer of soil or rock, or a set of strata, with particular characteristics.
- The line at which the earth's surface and the sky appear to meet.
- The range of interest or activity that can be anticipated.
