- *The circular boundary of the part of the earth's surface visible from a particular point, ignoring irregularities and obstructions.*
- *The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth.*
- *The limit of a person's knowledge, experience, or interest.*
- *A great circle of the celestial sphere, the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place.*
- *A layer of soil or rock, or a set of strata, with particular characteristics.*
- *The line at which the earth's surface and the sky appear to meet.*
- *The range of interest or activity that can be anticipated.*

<u><b>purview</b></u>	The range of interest or activity that can be anticipated. <i>Social taboos meant that little information was likely to come within the <b>purview</b> of women generally.</i>
<b>range of experience</b>	A variety of different things or activities.
<b>range of vision</b>	A kitchen appliance used for cooking food.
<u><b>scope</b></u>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Plato even maintains religion to be the chief aim and <b>scope</b> of human life.</i>
<b>skyline</b>	The line at which the sky and Earth appear to meet. <i>The <b>skyline</b> of the city.</i>
<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>His social <b>sphere</b> is limited.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>The end of the tunnel came into <b>view</b>.</i>
<u><b>vista</b></u>	A mental view of a succession of remembered or anticipated events. <i><b>Vistas</b> of freedom seemed to open ahead of him.</i>
