- Extremely unpleasant, horrifying, or terrible.
- Causing fear or dread or terror.

appalling Very bad; awful.

**Appalling** conditions.

Offensive or even (of persons) malicious.

An awful voice.

dire (of a warning or threat) presaging disaster.

There were **dire** warnings from the traffic organizations.

**direful** Extremely bad; dreadful.

A career or vengeance so **direful** that London was shocked.

dread Greatly feared dreadful.

The **dread** presence of the headmaster.



**dreaded** Regarded with great fear or apprehension.

The **dreaded** news came that Joe had been wounded.

**dreadful** Exceptionally bad or displeasing.

**Dreadful** manners.

**fearful** Lacking courage; ignobly timid and faint-hearted.

Fearful slum conditions.

fearsome Causing fear or dread or terror.

The cat mewed displaying a **fearsome** set of teeth.

**frightening** Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying.

A **frightening** experience.

**frightful** Used for emphasis, especially of something bad.

In a **frightful** hurry.

Gruesomely indicative of death or the dead.

ghastly

Gracesomery indicative of death of the dead

Ghastly shrieks.

Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty.

The **grim** task of burying the victims.

**grisly** Causing horror or disgust.

A **grisly** murder.

Causing repulsion or horror; grisly.

The most **gruesome** murder.

**hair-raising** Extremely alarming.

Acutely distressing.

harrowing Abarrowing film shout region

A **harrowing** film about racism and violence.

heinous Extremely wicked, deeply criminal.

**Heinous** accusations.

Extremely ugly.

hideous

Hideous lizard like creatures.

horrible Provoking horror- Winston Churchill.

A **horrible** massacre.

horrific Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror.

*Horrific* conditions in the mining industry.

**horrifying** Causing horror; extremely shocking. *An alarming even horrifying* picture.

macabre Disturbing because concerned with or causing a fear of death.

**Macabre** tales of war and plague in the Middle ages.

Extremely alarming.

**nightmarish** A **nightmarish** vision of the future.



Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation. shocking

She brought **shocking** news.

Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister. terrible

I was **terrible** at basketball.

Too bad or horrific to express in words. unspeakable Unspeakable happiness.

Causing or able to cause nausea. vile

As vile a rogue as ever lived.
