fearsome Frightening, especially in appearance.

frightening Causing fear or dread or terror.

frightful Provoking horror. *In a frightful hurry.*

ghastly Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror.

One of the most **ghastly** crimes ever committed.

Filled with melancholy and despondency.

The **grim** task of burying the victims.

grisly Causing horror or disgust.

A **grisly** murder.

Extremely unpleasant.

Gruesome evidence of human sacrifice.

harrowing Acutely distressing.

A **harrowing** film about racism and violence.

hideous So extremely ugly as to be terrifying.

A **hideous** pattern of injustice.

horrendous Causing fear or dread or terror.

Horrendous explosions shook the city.

horrible Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking.

A **horrible** massacre.

horrid Very unpleasant or disagreeable.

In some cases the animals have been abused and kept in **horrid** conditions.

horrifying Causing horror; extremely shocking.

An alarming even **horrifying** picture.



monstrous Shockingly brutal or cruel.

Twisted into **monstrous** shapes.

nauseating Causing or liable to cause a feeling of nausea or disgust; disgusting.

The stench was **nauseating**.

nightmarish Of the nature of a nightmare; very frightening or unpleasant.

A **nightmarish** vision of the future.

outrageous Shockingly bad or excessive.

Subjected to **outrageous** cruelty.

shocking Very bad.

She brought **shocking** news.

sickening Causing great annoyance or disappointment.

A **sickening** stench.

terrible Causing fear or dread or terror.

What a **terrible** mess.

unspeakable Exceptionally bad or displeasing.

An **unspeakable** odor came sweeping into the room.

fright Frighten.

Come be comforted he shan t **fright** you.

frighten Drive out by frightening.

If you say anything to him you might **frighten** him off.

frightening Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying.

A **frightening** experience.

frightful Extremely distressing.

Spent a **frightful** amount of money.

haunt Haunt like a ghost pursue.

The bar was a favourite **haunt** of artists of the time.

hideous Extremely unpleasant.

A hideous scar.

horror A literary or film genre concerned with arousing feelings of horror.

To her **horror** she found that a thief had stolen the machine.

Frighten or overawe (someone), especially in order to make them do what

intimidate one wants.

Her boss intimidates her.

monstrosity Something hideous or frightful.

They regarded the atom bomb as a **monstrosity**.

Feel or cause to feel panic.

Panic in the stock market.

Change (organic matter) into a stony substance by encrusting or

petrify replacing it with a calcareous, siliceous, or other mineral deposit.

Slogans **petrify** our thinking.

Become scared.

A bomb **scare** led them to evacuate the building.

I m **scared** stiff of flying.

scary Provoking fear terror.

terrible Extremely unpleasant or disagreeable.

terrify Cause to feel extreme fear.
