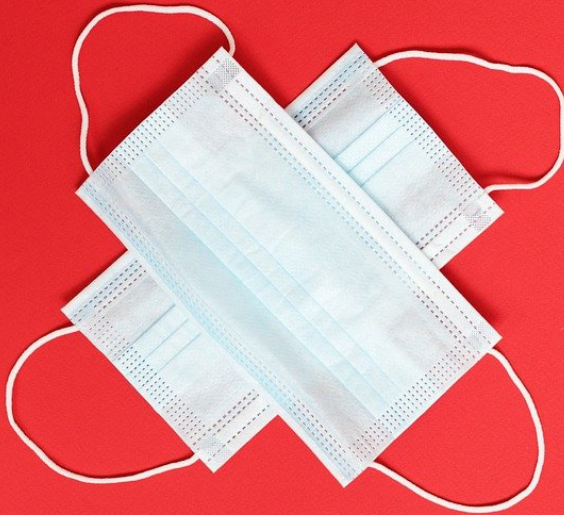

- *Disposed to treat guests and strangers with cordiality and generosity.*
- *Friendly and welcoming to visitors or guests.*
- *(of an environment) pleasant and favourable for living in.*
- *Having an open mind.*
- *Favorable to life and growth.*

- accommodating** Helpful in bringing about a harmonious adaptation.
*The warden was always **accommodating** in allowing visitors in.*
- amenable** Liable to answer to a higher authority.
*The president is **amenable** to the constitutional court.*
- amicable** Characterized by friendship and good will.
*An **amicable** settlement of the dispute.*
- bountiful** Producing in abundance.
*The ocean provided a **bountiful** supply of fresh food.*
- congenial** (of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination.
*He went back to a climate more **congenial** to his cold stony soul.*
- convivial** (of an atmosphere or event) friendly, lively, and enjoyable.

cordial	Politely warm and friendly. <i>Cordial relations.</i>
friendly	Denoting something that is adapted for or is not harmful to a specified thing. <i>User friendly computers.</i>
generous	More than is usual or necessary. <i>A generous helping of pasta.</i>
genial	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>Our genial host.</i>
gracious	Characterized by charm, good taste, and generosity of spirit. <i>He bears insult with gracious good humor.</i>
helpful	Useful. <i>Pages of helpful information.</i>
kind	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>A dry climate kind to asthmatics.</i>
kind-hearted	Having or proceeding from an innately kind disposition.
kindly	Pleasant and agreeable. <i>A kindly climate.</i>
liberal	Relating to a Liberal party or (in the UK) the Liberal Democrat Party. <i>She is under attack from the right wing for making her own liberal political views known.</i>
neighbourly	Characteristic of a good neighbour, especially in being helpful, friendly, or kind. <i>Shopping for the elderly is a regular feature of neighbourly support.</i>
obliging	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>The obliging waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
sociable	Willing to talk and engage in activities with other people; friendly. <i>Americans are sociable and gregarious.</i>
warm	Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows. <i>Warm support.</i>
welcoming	Very cordial. <i>The cast and crew were very welcoming.</i>
well disposed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

- complaisant** Willing to please others or to accept what they do or say without protest.

friendly	A game or match that does not form part of a serious competition. <i>Friendly rivalry between the two schools.</i>
genial	Friendly and cheerful. <i>The genial sunshine.</i>
greet	Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>Everyone greeted this idea warmly.</i>
gregarious	(of animals) living in flocks or loosely organized communities. <i>In the wild trees are usually gregarious plants.</i>
guest	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A guest speaker.</i>
hearty	Loudly vigorous and cheerful. <i>A hearty and boisterous character.</i>
hi	An expression of greeting.
hospitality	The friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. <i>Scotland is renowned for its hospitality.</i>
host	Be the host of or for. <i>They were always gracious hosts at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.</i>
hostess	A woman host. <i>The perfect dinner party hostess.</i>
kindly	Pleasant and agreeable. <i>Kindly criticism.</i>
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
obliging	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>The obliging waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
open	Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness. <i>The service is open to all students.</i>
pervious	(of a substance) allowing water to pass through; permeable. <i>Pervious rocks.</i>

- receptive** Able to absorb liquid (not repellent).
*The paper is ink **receptive**.*
- salute** Make a formal salute to.
*He clicked his heels and **saluted**.*
- unprejudiced** Not having or showing a dislike or distrust based on fixed or preconceived ideas.
*An **unprejudiced** appraisal of the pros and cons.*
- warm** Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows when referring to color.
*You re getting **warm**.*
- welcome** Bid welcome to greet upon arrival.
*We **welcome** any comments.*
- welcoming** Behaving in a polite or friendly way to a guest or new arrival.
*The cast and crew were very **welcoming**.*
