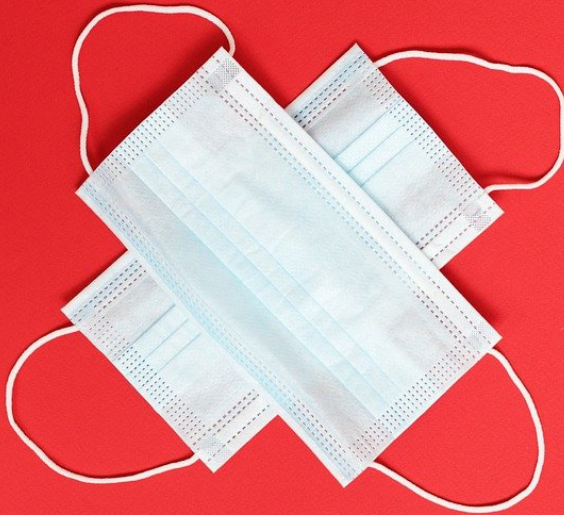

### Definitions of "Hospitable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hospitable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Disposed to treat guests and strangers with cordiality and generosity.*
- *Friendly and welcoming to visitors or guests.*
- *(of an environment) pleasant and favourable for living in.*
- *Having an open mind.*
- *Favorable to life and growth.*



## Synonyms of "Hospitable" as an adjective (22 Words)

- accommodating** Helpful in bringing about a harmonious adaptation.  
*The warden was always **accommodating** in allowing visitors in.*
- amenable** Liable to answer to a higher authority.  
*The president is **amenable** to the constitutional court.*
- amicable** Characterized by friendship and good will.  
*An **amicable** settlement of the dispute.*
- bountiful** Producing in abundance.  
*The ocean provided a **bountiful** supply of fresh food.*
- congenial** (of a thing) pleasant or agreeable because suited to one's taste or inclination.  
*He went back to a climate more **congenial** to his cold stony soul.*
- convivial** (of an atmosphere or event) friendly, lively, and enjoyable.  
*A **convivial** atmosphere at the reunion.*

<b>cordial</b>	Politely warm and friendly. <i><b>Cordial</b> relations.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Denoting something that is adapted for or is not harmful to a specified thing. <i>User <b>friendly</b> computers.</i>
<b>generous</b>	More than is usual or necessary. <i>A <b>generous</b> helping of pasta.</i>
<b>genial</b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>Our <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<b>gracious</b>	Characterized by charm, good taste, and generosity of spirit. <i>He bears insult with <b>gracious</b> good humor.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Useful. <i>Pages of <b>helpful</b> information.</i>
<b>kind</b>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>A dry climate <b>kind</b> to asthmatics.</i>
<b>kind-hearted</b>	Having or proceeding from an innately kind disposition.
<b>kindly</b>	Pleasant and agreeable. <i>A <b>kindly</b> climate.</i>
<b>liberal</b>	Relating to a Liberal party or (in the UK) the Liberal Democrat Party. <i>She is under attack from the right wing for making her own <b>liberal</b> political views known.</i>
<b>neighbourly</b>	Characteristic of a good neighbour, especially in being helpful, friendly, or kind. <i>Shopping for the elderly is a regular feature of <b>neighbourly</b> support.</i>
<b>obliging</b>	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>The <b>obliging</b> waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
<b>sociable</b>	Willing to talk and engage in activities with other people; friendly. <i>Americans are <b>sociable</b> and gregarious.</i>
<b>warm</b>	Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows. <i><b>Warm</b> support.</i>
<b>welcoming</b>	Very cordial. <i>The cast and crew were very <b>welcoming</b>.</i>
<b>well disposed</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

- amicability** A disinclination to quarrel.
- anteroom** An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.
- client** A person who seeks the advice of a lawyer.  
*Friendly **client** programs like this enable you to perform complicated actions in just a mouse press or two.*
- complaisant** Willing to please others or to accept what they do or say without protest.  
*To close one's eyes like a **complaisant** husband whose wife has taken a lover.*
- cordial** Strongly felt.

<b>curtsy</b>	Perform a curtsy. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>customer</b>	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>He s a tough <b>customer</b>.</i>
<b>extroverted</b>	Outgoing and socially confident. <i>She is <b>extroverted</b> confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	A game or match that does not form part of a serious competition. <i><b>Friendly</b> rivalry between the two schools.</i>
<b>genial</b>	Friendly and cheerful. <i>The <b>genial</b> sunshine.</i>
<b>greet</b>	Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>Everyone <b>greeted</b> this idea warmly.</i>
<b>gregarious</b>	(of animals) living in flocks or loosely organized communities. <i>In the wild trees are usually <b>gregarious</b> plants.</i>
<b>guest</b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A <b>guest</b> speaker.</i>
<b>hearty</b>	Loudly vigorous and cheerful. <i>A <b>hearty</b> and boisterous character.</i>
<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>hospitality</b>	The friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. <i>Scotland is renowned for its <b>hospitality</b>.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>They were always gracious <b>hosts</b> at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.</i>
<b>hostess</b>	A woman host. <i>The perfect dinner party <b>hostess</b>.</i>
<b>kindly</b>	Pleasant and agreeable. <i><b>Kindly</b> criticism.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
<b>obliging</b>	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>The <b>obliging</b> waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
<b>open</b>	Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness. <i>The service is <b>open</b> to all students.</i>
<b>pervious</b>	(of a substance) allowing water to pass through; permeable. <i><b>Pervious</b> rocks.</i>

- receptive** Able to absorb liquid (not repellent).  
*The paper is ink **receptive**.*
- salute** Make a formal salute to.  
*He clicked his heels and **saluted**.*
- unprejudiced** Not having or showing a dislike or distrust based on fixed or preconceived ideas.  
*An **unprejudiced** appraisal of the pros and cons.*
- warm** Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows when referring to color.  
*You re getting **warm**.*
- welcome** Bid welcome to greet upon arrival.  
*We **welcome** any comments.*
- welcoming** Behaving in a polite or friendly way to a guest or new arrival.  
*The cast and crew were very **welcoming**.*
