Definitions of "Hostel" as a noun

- *An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.*
- *Inexpensive supervised lodging (especially for youths on bicycling trips.*
- *An inn providing accommodation.*
- *A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.*

auberge	An inn in a French-speaking country.
bed and breakfast	A piece of furniture that provides a place to sleep.
boarding house	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
guest house	Any computer that is hooked up to a computer network.
hostelry	An inn or pub.
inn	A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation. <i>We should find an inn for the night.</i>
lodge	A branch or meeting place of an organization such as the Freemasons. <i>A hunting lodge.</i>
pension	A regular payment to a person that is intended to allow them to subsist without working. <i>Men can draw a pension from the age of sixty five.</i>
student lodging	A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines.
youth hostel	An early period of development.

- accommodation** A settlement of differences.
*There was lifeboat **accommodation** for 1 178 people.*
- apartment** A block of apartments.
*A district of six storey **apartments** arranged along narrow streets.*
- bed** A bed and associated facilities comprising a place for a patient in a hospital.
*The inn keeper could **bed** all the new arrivals.*
- bedside** Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).
*He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.*
- berth** Secure in or as if in a berth or dock.
*The ship **berthed** at Plymouth.*

booking	An instance of a player being cautioned by the referee for foul play. <i>The hotel does not handle group bookings.</i>
bunk	Provide with a bunk. <i>We bunked the children upstairs.</i>
caravan	Travel in a caravan. <i>They spent a fishing holiday in a caravan.</i>
chamber	Place in a chamber. <i>A burial chamber.</i>
dine	Have supper; eat dinner. <i>We dined at a restaurant.</i>
diner	A small roadside restaurant with a long counter and booths.
dinner	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>A candlelit dinner for two.</i>
evening	An evening characterized by a particular event or activity. <i>It was the evening of the Roman Empire.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
hostelry	A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.
hotel	An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists. <i>A five star hotel.</i>
housing	Houses and flats considered collectively. <i>A housing association.</i>
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The image had lodged in her mind.</i>
lodging	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for lodgings and a job.</i>
motel	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
overnight	Done happening or for use overnight. <i>You can recharge the battery overnight.</i>
pub	Frequent pubs. <i>All that pubbing isn't good for the liver.</i>

reservation	An expression of doubt qualifying overall approval of a plan or statement. <i>Some generals voiced reservations about making air strikes.</i>
<u>restaurant</u>	A place where people pay to sit and eat meals that are cooked and served on the premises.
<u>room</u>	The people who are present in a room. <i>There s room for improvement in the way the programme is managed.</i>
<u>sheltered</u>	Protected from difficulties or unpleasant realities. <i>A sheltered harbor.</i>
sleeper	A sofa or chair that converts into a bed. <i>We were waiting for the Inverness London sleeper.</i>
<u>suite</u>	A set of rooms designated for one person's or family's use or for a particular purpose. <i>Potassic rock suites are a characteristic feature of the area.</i>
<u>there</u>	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i>There comes a point where you give up.</i>
