
## Hostel as a Noun

## Definitions of "Hostel" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "hostel" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.
- Inexpensive supervised lodging (especially for youths on bicycling trips.
- An inn providing accommodation.
- A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.

auberge	An inn in a French-speaking country.	
<b>bed and breakfast</b> A piece of furniture that provides a place to sleep.		
boarding house	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.	
guest house	Any computer that is hooked up to a computer network.	
hostelry	An inn or pub.	
inn	A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation. <i>We should find an <b>inn</b> for the night.</i>	
lodge	A branch or meeting place of an organization such as the Freemasons. <i>A hunting <b>lodge</b></i> .	
pension	A regular payment to a person that is intended to allow them to subsist without working. Men can draw a <b>pension</b> from the age of sixty five.	
student lodging	A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines.	
youth hostel	An early period of development.	





## Associations of "Hostel" (30 Words)

accommodation	A settlement of differences. There was lifeboat <b>accommodation</b> for 1 178 people.
<u>apartment</u>	A block of apartments. A district of six storey <b>apartment</b> s arranged along narrow streets.
bed	A bed and associated facilities comprising a place for a patient in a hospital. The inn keeper could <b>bed</b> all the new arrivals.
bedside	Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person. <i>He was summoned to the <b>bedside</b> of a dying man.</i>
berth	Secure in or as if in a berth or dock. The ship <b>berth</b> ed at Plymouth.



<u>booking</u>	An instance of a player being cautioned by the referee for foul play. <i>The hotel does not handle group</i> <b>booking</b> s.
<u>bunk</u>	Provide with a bunk. We <b>bunk</b> ed the children upstairs.
caravan	Travel in a caravan. They spent a fishing holiday in a <b>caravan</b> .
<u>chamber</u>	Place in a chamber. A burial <b>chamber</b> .
dine	Have supper; eat dinner. <i>We <b>dine</b>d at a restaurant.</i>
diner	A small roadside restaurant with a long counter and booths.
<u>dinner</u>	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. A candlelit <b>dinner</b> for two.
<u>evening</u>	An evening characterized by a particular event or activity. It was the <b>evening</b> of the Roman Empire.
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. They are living in a <b>flophouse</b> and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.
hostelry	A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.
<u>hotel</u>	An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists. <i>A five star <b>hotel</b></i> .
<u>housing</u>	Houses and flats considered collectively. A <b>housing</b> association.
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. The image had <b>lodge</b> d in her mind.
lodging	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for <b>lodging</b>s and a job.</i>
motel	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
overnight	Done happening or for use overnight. You can recharge the battery <b>overnight</b> .
pub	Frequent pubs. All that <b>pub</b> bing isn t good for the liver.



reservation	An expression of doubt qualifying overall approval of a plan or statement. Some generals voiced <b>reservations</b> about making air strikes.
<u>restaurant</u>	A place where people pay to sit and eat meals that are cooked and served on the premises.
<u>room</u>	The people who are present in a room. There s <b>room</b> for improvement in the way the programme is managed.
<u>sheltered</u>	Protected from difficulties or unpleasant realities. A <b>sheltered</b> harbor.
sleeper	A sofa or chair that converts into a bed. We were waiting for the Inverness London <b>sleeper</b> .
<u>suite</u>	A set of rooms designated for one person's or family's use or for a particular purpose. Potassic rock <b>suite</b> s are a characteristic feature of the area.
<u>there</u>	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i>There</i> comes a point where you give up.
