### Definitions of "Hostel" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hostel” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.*
- *Inexpensive supervised lodging (especially for youths on bicycling trips.*
- *An inn providing accommodation.*
- *A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.*



## Synonyms of "Hostel" as a noun (10 Words)

<b>auberge</b>	An inn in a French-speaking country.
<b>bed and breakfast</b>	A piece of furniture that provides a place to sleep.
<b>boarding house</b>	The act of passengers and crew getting aboard a ship or aircraft.
<b>guest house</b>	Any computer that is hooked up to a computer network.
<b>hostelry</b>	An inn or pub.
<b>inn</b>	A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation. <i>We should find an <b>inn</b> for the night.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	A branch or meeting place of an organization such as the Freemasons. <i>A hunting <b>lodge</b>.</i>
<b>pension</b>	A regular payment to a person that is intended to allow them to subsist without working. <i>Men can draw a <b>pension</b> from the age of sixty five.</i>
<b>student lodging</b>	A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines.
<b>youth hostel</b>	An early period of development.





## Associations of "Hostel" (30 Words)

<b>accommodation</b>	A settlement of differences. <i>There was lifeboat <b>accommodation</b> for 1 178 people.</i>
<b><u>apartment</u></b>	A block of apartments. <i>A district of six storey <b>apartments</b> arranged along narrow streets.</i>
<b>bed</b>	A bed and associated facilities comprising a place for a patient in a hospital. <i>The inn keeper could <b>bed</b> all the new arrivals.</i>
<b>bedside</b>	Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person). <i>He was summoned to the <b>bedside</b> of a dying man.</i>
<b>berth</b>	Secure in or as if in a berth or dock. <i>The ship <b>berthed</b> at Plymouth.</i>

<b><u>booking</u></b>	An instance of a player being cautioned by the referee for foul play. <i>The hotel does not handle group <b>bookings</b>.</i>
<b><u>bunk</u></b>	Provide with a bunk. <i>We <b>bunked</b> the children upstairs.</i>
<b>caravan</b>	Travel in a caravan. <i>They spent a fishing holiday in a <b>caravan</b>.</i>
<b><u>chamber</u></b>	Place in a chamber. <i>A burial <b>chamber</b>.</i>
<b>dine</b>	Have supper; eat dinner. <i>We <b>dined</b> at a restaurant.</i>
<b>diner</b>	A small roadside restaurant with a long counter and booths.
<b><u>dinner</u></b>	A party of people assembled to have dinner together. <i>A candlelit <b>dinner</b> for two.</i>
<b><u>evening</u></b>	An evening characterized by a particular event or activity. <i>It was the <b>evening</b> of the Roman Empire.</i>
<b>flophouse</b>	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a <b>flophouse</b> and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
<b>hostelry</b>	A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.
<b><u>hotel</u></b>	An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists. <i>A five star <b>hotel</b>.</i>
<b><u>housing</u></b>	Houses and flats considered collectively. <i>A <b>housing</b> association.</i>
<b>invulnerable</b>	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The image had <b>lodged</b> in her mind.</i>
<b>lodging</b>	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for <b>lodgings</b> and a job.</i>
<b>motel</b>	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
<b>overnight</b>	Done happening or for use overnight. <i>You can recharge the battery <b>overnight</b>.</i>
<b>pub</b>	Frequent pubs. <i>All that <b>pubbing</b> isn't good for the liver.</i>

<b>reservation</b>	An expression of doubt qualifying overall approval of a plan or statement. <i>Some generals voiced <b>reservations</b> about making air strikes.</i>
<u><b>restaurant</b></u>	A place where people pay to sit and eat meals that are cooked and served on the premises.
<u><b>room</b></u>	The people who are present in a room. <i>There s <b>room</b> for improvement in the way the programme is managed.</i>
<u><b>sheltered</b></u>	Protected from difficulties or unpleasant realities. <i>A <b>sheltered</b> harbor.</i>
<b>sleeper</b>	A sofa or chair that converts into a bed. <i>We were waiting for the Inverness London <b>sleeper</b>.</i>
<u><b>suite</b></u>	A set of rooms designated for one person's or family's use or for a particular purpose. <i>Potassic rock <b>suites</b> are a characteristic feature of the area.</i>
<u><b>there</b></u>	To or toward that place; away from the speaker. <i><b>There</b> comes a point where you give up.</i>
