Definitions of "Hotel" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "hotel" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A code word representing the letter H, used in radio communication.
- A building where travelers can pay for lodging and meals and other services.
- A restaurant or cafe.
- An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists.
- *A pub.*





Synonyms of "Hotel" as a noun (5 Words)

hostelry A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.

- **inn** A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation. *We should find an inn for the night.*
- ${\rm taproom} \ {\rm A\ room\ in\ which\ alcoholic\ drinks,\ especially\ beer,\ are\ available\ on\ tap;\ a\ bar\ in\ a} \ {\rm pub\ or\ hotel}.$
- **tavern** An inn or pub. *He had spent some time in a nearby* **tavern** *and was drunk.*

wine bar Fermented juice (of grapes especially.





Usage Examples of "Hotel" as a noun

- A hotel room.
- A five-star hotel.
- A group of four friends had gone to have dinner at a roadside hotel.





Associations of "Hotel" (30 Words)

accommodation	The process of adapting or adjusting to someone or something. The prime minister was seeking an accommodation with Labour.
antechamber	A small room leading to a main one. The antechamber to an interview room.
anteroom	An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.
<u>apartment</u>	A block of apartments. A district of six storey apartment s arranged along narrow streets.
bedside	The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's bed. He was summoned to the bedside of a dying man.
boarding	The action of getting on or into a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle. Students all had to pay boarding fees.



caravan	Travel in a caravan. We were part of a caravan of almost a thousand camels.
condominium	Each of the individual apartments or houses in a condominium. Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian condominium .
doorstep	A step leading up to the outer door of a house. <i>He put his foot on the doorstep of the cottage.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.
foyer	A large entrance or reception room or area. The foyer of the concert hall.
french	Cut (e.g, beans) lengthwise in preparation for cooking.
frenchman	A person of French nationality.
german	Germane.
<u>guest</u>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. I have two guest s coming to dinner tonight.
<u>hall</u>	A building or large room used for meetings, concerts, or other events. <i>Lecture hall.</i>
<u>hostel</u>	An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.
hostess	A woman innkeeper. The perfect dinner party hostess .
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>The house was full.</i>
<u>lobby</u>	An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in their favor typically through lobbying. <i>They went into the hotel lobby</i> .
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. The image had lodge d in her mind.
lodging	The act of lodging. A fee for board and lodging .
manchester	A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart of the most densely populated area of England.
motel	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
overnight	Done happening or for use overnight. You can recharge the battery overnight .



reservation	(in the Roman Catholic Church) the action of a superior of reserving to himself the power of absolution. <i>He recommended her without any reservations.</i>
resort	A hotel located in a resort area. A seaside resort .
<u>room</u>	Share a room house or flat especially a rented one at a college or similar institution. The room s were very small but they had a nice view.
<u>suite</u>	A set of selected pieces from an opera or musical, arranged to be played as one instrumental work. <i>Potassic rock suites are a characteristic feature of the area.</i>
tourist	Travel as a tourist. American families tourist ing abroad.
