Hotel as a Noun

Definitions of "Hotel" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hotel” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A code word representing the letter H, used in radio communication.*
- *A building where travelers can pay for lodging and meals and other services.*
- *A restaurant or cafe.*
- *An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists.*
- *A pub.*



Synonyms of "Hotel" as a noun (5 Words)

hostelry A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.

inn A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation.
*We should find an **inn** for the night.*

taproom A room in which alcoholic drinks, especially beer, are available on tap; a bar in a pub or hotel.

tavern An inn or pub.
*He had spent some time in a nearby **tavern** and was drunk.*

wine bar Fermented juice (of grapes especially).



Usage Examples of "Hotel" as a noun

- *A hotel room.*
- *A five-star hotel.*
- *A group of four friends had gone to have dinner at a roadside hotel.*



Associations of "Hotel" (30 Words)

- accommodation** The process of adapting or adjusting to someone or something.
*The prime minister was seeking an **accommodation** with Labour.*
- antechamber** A small room leading to a main one.
*The **antechamber** to an interview room.*
- anteroom** An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.
- apartment** A block of apartments.
*A district of six storey **apartments** arranged along narrow streets.*
- bedside** The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's bed).
*He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.*
- boarding** The action of getting on or into a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle.
*Students all had to pay **boarding** fees.*

caravan	Travel in a caravan. <i>We were part of a caravan of almost a thousand camels.</i>
condominium	Each of the individual apartments or houses in a condominium. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian condominium.</i>
doorstep	A step leading up to the outer door of a house. <i>He put his foot on the doorstep of the cottage.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
foyer	A large entrance or reception room or area. <i>The foyer of the concert hall.</i>
french	Cut (e.g, beans) lengthwise in preparation for cooking.
frenchman	A person of French nationality.
german	Germane.
guest	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>I have two guests coming to dinner tonight.</i>
hall	A building or large room used for meetings, concerts, or other events. <i>Lecture hall.</i>
hostel	An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.
hostess	A woman innkeeper. <i>The perfect dinner party hostess.</i>
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>The house was full.</i>
lobby	An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in their favor typically through lobbying. <i>They went into the hotel lobby.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The image had lodged in her mind.</i>
lodging	The act of lodging. <i>A fee for board and lodging.</i>
manchester	A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart of the most densely populated area of England.
motel	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
overnight	Done happening or for use overnight. <i>You can recharge the battery overnight.</i>

reservation	(in the Roman Catholic Church) the action of a superior of reserving to himself the power of absolution. <i>He recommended her without any reservations.</i>
resort	A hotel located in a resort area. <i>A seaside resort.</i>
room	Share a room house or flat especially a rented one at a college or similar institution. <i>The rooms were very small but they had a nice view.</i>
suite	A set of selected pieces from an opera or musical, arranged to be played as one instrumental work. <i>Potassic rock suites are a characteristic feature of the area.</i>
tourist	Travel as a tourist. <i>American families touristing abroad.</i>
