## Hotel as a Noun

### Definitions of "Hotel" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hotel” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A code word representing the letter H, used in radio communication.*
- *A building where travelers can pay for lodging and meals and other services.*
- *A restaurant or cafe.*
- *An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists.*
- *A pub.*



## Synonyms of "Hotel" as a noun (5 Words)

**hostelry** A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.

**inn** A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation.  
*We should find an **inn** for the night.*

**taproom** A room in which alcoholic drinks, especially beer, are available on tap; a bar in a pub or hotel.

**tavern** An inn or pub.  
*He had spent some time in a nearby **tavern** and was drunk.*

**wine bar** Fermented juice (of grapes especially).



## Usage Examples of "Hotel" as a noun

- A *hotel room*.
- A *five-star hotel*.
- A *group of four friends had gone to have dinner at a roadside hotel*.





## Associations of "Hotel" (30 Words)

<b>accommodation</b>	The process of adapting or adjusting to someone or something. <i>The prime minister was seeking an <b>accommodation</b> with Labour.</i>
<b>antechamber</b>	A small room leading to a main one. <i>The <b>antechamber</b> to an interview room.</i>
<b>anteroom</b>	An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.
<b><u>apartment</u></b>	A block of apartments. <i>A district of six storey <b>apartments</b> arranged along narrow streets.</i>
<b>bedside</b>	The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's bed). <i>He was summoned to the <b>bedside</b> of a dying man.</i>
<b>boarding</b>	The action of getting on or into a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle. <i>Students all had to pay <b>boarding</b> fees.</i>

<b>caravan</b>	Travel in a caravan. <i>We were part of a <b>caravan</b> of almost a thousand camels.</i>
<b>condominium</b>	Each of the individual apartments or houses in a condominium. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian <b>condominium</b>.</i>
<b>doorstep</b>	A step leading up to the outer door of a house. <i>He put his foot on the <b>doorstep</b> of the cottage.</i>
<b>flophouse</b>	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a <b>flophouse</b> and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
<b>foyer</b>	A large entrance or reception room or area. <i>The <b>foyer</b> of the concert hall.</i>
<b>french</b>	Cut (e.g, beans) lengthwise in preparation for cooking.
<b>frenchman</b>	A person of French nationality.
<b>german</b>	Germane.
<b>guest</b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>I have two <b>guests</b> coming to dinner tonight.</i>
<b>hall</b>	A building or large room used for meetings, concerts, or other events. <i>Lecture <b>hall</b>.</i>
<b>hostel</b>	An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.
<b>hostess</b>	A woman innkeeper. <i>The perfect dinner party <b>hostess</b>.</i>
<b>house</b>	The people living in a house a household. <i>The <b>house</b> was full.</i>
<b>lobby</b>	An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in their favor typically through lobbying. <i>They went into the hotel <b>lobby</b>.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The image had <b>lodged</b> in her mind.</i>
<b>lodging</b>	The act of lodging. <i>A fee for board and <b>lodging</b>.</i>
<b>manchester</b>	A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart of the most densely populated area of England.
<b>motel</b>	A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the rooms arranged in low blocks with parking directly outside.
<b>overnight</b>	Done happening or for use overnight. <i>You can recharge the battery <b>overnight</b>.</i>

<b>reservation</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) the action of a superior of reserving to himself the power of absolution. <i>He recommended her without any <b>reservations</b>.</i>
<b>resort</b>	A hotel located in a resort area. <i>A seaside <b>resort</b>.</i>
<u><b>room</b></u>	Share a room house or flat especially a rented one at a college or similar institution. <i>The <b>rooms</b> were very small but they had a nice view.</i>
<u><b>suite</b></u>	A set of selected pieces from an opera or musical, arranged to be played as one instrumental work. <i>Potassic rock <b>suites</b> are a characteristic feature of the area.</i>
<b>tourist</b>	Travel as a tourist. <i>American families <b>touristing</b> abroad.</i>
