
Hotel as a Noun

Definitions of "Hotel" as a noun

- A building where travelers can pay for lodging and meals and other services.
- A restaurant or cafe.
- An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists.
- *A pub*.





Synonyms of "Hotel" as a noun (5 Words)

hostelry A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.

inn

A pub, typically one in the country, in some cases providing accommodation.

We should find an inn for the night.

taproom A room in which alcoholic drinks, especially beer, are available on tap; a bar in a pub or hotel.

An inn or pub.

He had spent some time in a nearby **tavern** and was drunk.

wine bar Fermented juice (of grapes especially.

accommodation The process of adapting or adjusting to someone or something.

The prime minister was seeking an accommodation with Labour.

antechamber A small room leading to a main one.

The **antechamber** to an interview room.

anteroom An antechamber, typically serving as a waiting room.

A block of apartments.

A district of six storey **apartment**s arranged along narrow streets.

The space beside a bed (used especially with reference to an invalid's

bedside bed.

He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.

boardingThe action of getting on or into a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle.

caravan Travel in a caravan.

condominium Each of the individual apartments or houses in a condominium.

doorstep A step leading up to the outer door of a house.

He put his foot on the **doorstep** of the cottage.

A cheap lodging house.

flophouse They are living in a **flophouse** and discovering that the streets are not

paved with gold.

foyer A large entrance or reception room or area.

The **foyer** of the concert hall.

french Cut (e.g, beans) lengthwise in preparation for cooking.

frenchman A person of French nationality.

german Germane.

A person staying at a hotel or guest house.

I have two **guest**s coming to dinner tonight.

A building or large room used for meetings, concerts, or other events.

Lecture hall.

hostel An establishment which provides inexpensive food and lodging for a

specific group of people, such as students, workers, or travellers.

hostess A woman innkeeper.

The perfect dinner party **hostess**.

The people living in a house a household.

The **house** was full.

An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act

in their favor typically through lobbying.

They went into the hotel lobby.

lodge Be a lodger stay temporarily.

The image had **lodge**d in her mind.

lodgingThe act of lodging.

lobby

A fee for board and **lodging**.

manchester A city in northwestern England (30 miles to the east of Liverpool); heart

of the most densely populated area of England.

motel A roadside hotel designed primarily for motorists, typically having the
