<u>container</u>	A discrete environment set up within an operating system in which one or more applications may be run, typically assigned only those resources necessary for the application to function correctly. <i>The cakes will keep for up to two weeks if kept in an airtight container.</i>
cover	A covering that serves to conceal or shelter something. <i>A manhole cover.</i>
covering	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>Under a covering of dust.</i>
encasement	The act of enclosing something in a case.
enclosure	Something (usually a supporting document) that is enclosed in an envelope with a covering letter. <i>The nuns kept strict enclosure.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its holder.</i>
homes	A social unit living together. <i>They raise money to provide homes for the homeless.</i>
houses	A dwelling that serves as living quarters for one or more families.
jacket	A jacket potato. <i>Potatoes cooked in their jackets.</i>
living accommodations	The condition of living or the state of being alive.
lodging	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for lodgings and a job.</i>
places of residence	A job in an organization.
sheath	A close-fitting cover for the blade of a knife or sword. <i>The fatty sheath around nerve fibres.</i>
<u>shell</u>	Something resembling or likened to a shell because of its shape or its function as an outer case. <i>Baked pastry shells filled with cheese.</i>
trapping	A light two-wheeled carriage.

furnished	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A furnished apartment.</i>
