Definitions of "Hub" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hub” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A central airport or other transport facility from which many services operate.*
- *The central part of a wheel, rotating on or with the axle, and from which the spokes radiate.*
- *A center of activity or interest or commerce or transportation; a focal point around which events revolve.*
- *The central part of a car wheel (or fan or propeller etc) through which the shaft or axle passes.*
- *The effective centre of an activity, region, or network.*



Synonyms of "Hub" as a noun (13 Words)

axis	The main stem or central part about which plant organs or plant parts such as branches are arranged. <i>The Earth revolves on its axis once every 24 hours.</i>
centre	A place where some particular activity is concentrated. <i>A conference centre.</i>
centre of activity	The capacity of a substance to take part in a chemical reaction.
centre point	A contact in the distributor; as the rotor turns its projecting arm contacts them and current flows to the spark plugs.
core	The central meaning or theme of a speech or literary work. <i>The ball has a titanium core.</i>

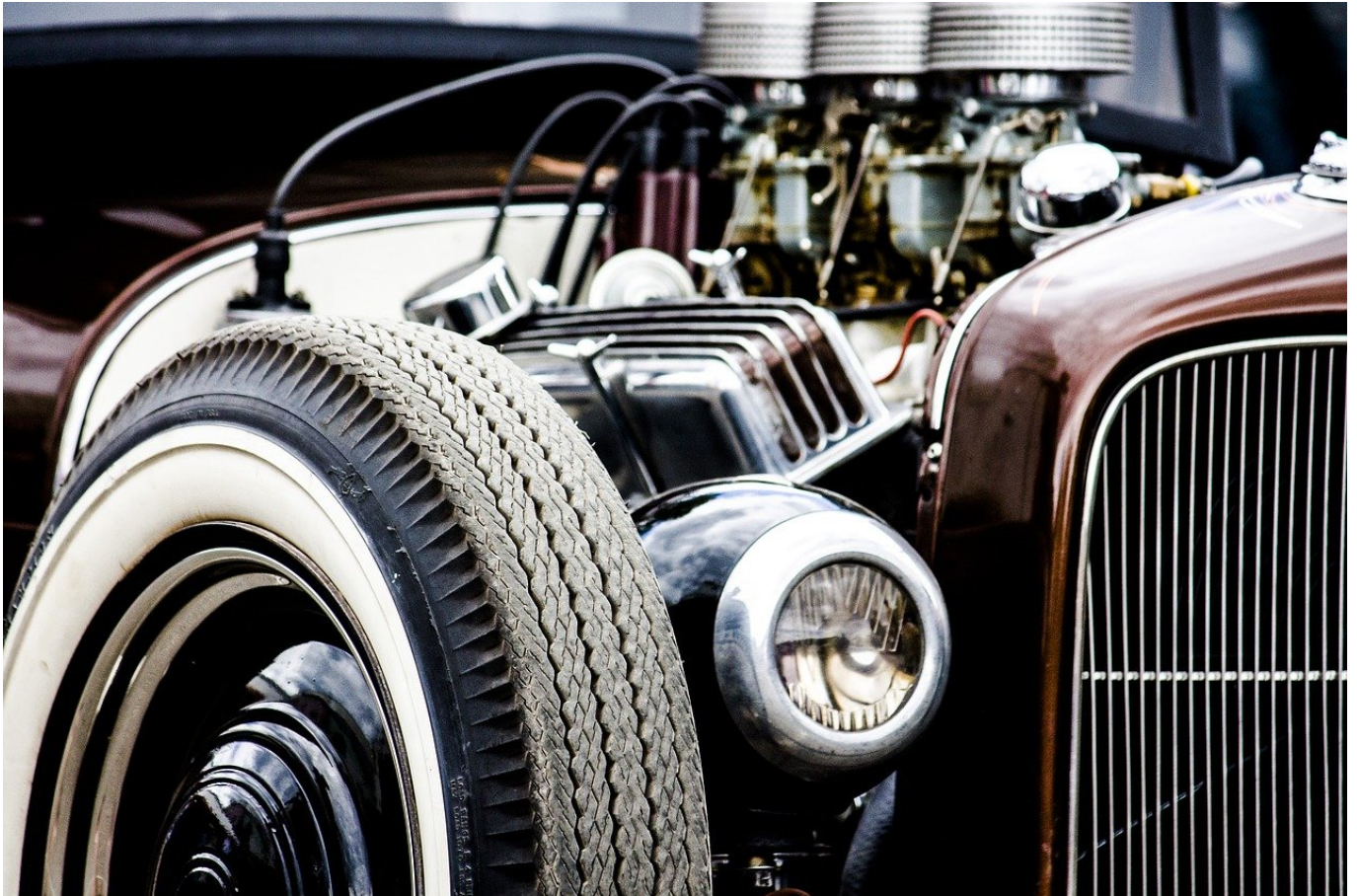
focus	The state or quality of having or producing clear visual definition. <i>Out of focus.</i>
fulcrum	The pivot about which a lever turns. <i>Research is the fulcrum of the academic community.</i>
heart	The heart regarded as the centre of a person's thoughts and emotions especially love compassion or loyalty. <i>You haven't got the heart for baseball.</i>
kernel	A single whole grain of a cereal. <i>This is the kernel of the argument.</i>
middle	The middle area of the human torso usually in front. <i>He had a towel round his middle.</i>
nerve centre	Impudent aggressiveness.
nucleus	(astronomy) the center of the head of a comet; consists of small solid particles of ice and frozen gas that vaporizes on approaching the sun to form the coma and tail. <i>The nucleus of a British film producing industry.</i>
pivot	A movement in which the player holding the ball may move in any direction with one foot while keeping the other the pivot foot in contact with the floor. <i>The pivot of community life was the chapel.</i>



Usage Examples of "Hub" as a noun

- *The city's major transportation hub for bus and rail.*

- *The city has always been the financial hub of the country.*
- *The airport authority's policy promotes Manchester as an international hub.*

chief	A person who is in charge. <i>The chief reason for the spending cuts.</i>
city	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The city voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
civic	Relating to a city or town, especially its administration; municipal. <i>Civic pride.</i>
concentric	Of or denoting circles, arcs, or other shapes which share the same centre, the larger often completely surrounding the smaller. <i>Concentric circles indicate distances of 1 km 2 km and 3 km from the centre.</i>
core	Remove the core or center from. <i>Core an apple.</i>
depopulate	Reduce in population. <i>The disease could depopulate a town the size of Bournemouth.</i>
elements	Violent or severe weather viewed as caused by the action of the four elements. <i>They felt the full fury of the elements.</i>
equatorial	A telescope whose mounting has only two axes of motion, one parallel to the Earth's axis and the other one at right angles to it. <i>Equatorial regions.</i>
essentialness	Basic importance.
focal	Having or localized centrally at a focus. <i>Focal point.</i>
focus	Place the focus on an element of a sentence. <i>Out of focus.</i>
gist	The real point of an action. <i>I need a good friend I can always gist with.</i>
key	Vandalize a car by scraping its paint with a key. <i>She keyed in a series of commands.</i>
leading	The activity of leading. <i>The leading man.</i>
main	The open ocean. <i>The main problem is one of resources.</i>
major	Of an interval equivalent to that between the tonic and another note of a major scale and greater by a semitone than the corresponding minor interval. <i>She is a linguistics major.</i>

metropolis	A large and densely populated urban area; may include several independent administrative districts. <i>By the late eighteenth century Edo had grown to a metropolis with a population of nearly one million.</i>
<u>pivot</u>	The act of turning on or as if on a pivot. <i>The pivot of community life was the chapel.</i>
<u>pivotal</u>	Being of crucial importance- Henry Kissinger. <i>A sliding or pivotal motion.</i>
<u>primary</u>	A primary feather. <i>A primary instinct.</i>
prime	A prime number. <i>The prime of the world.</i>
principal	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>A design consultancy whose principal is based in San Francisco.</i>
reel	A length of something wound on to a reel. <i>She reeled back against the van.</i>
<u>spoke</u>	Each of the bars or wire rods connecting the centre of a wheel to its outer edge.
swivel	Turn around a point or axis or on a swivel. <i>She swivelled her eyes round.</i>
urban	Located in or characteristic of a city or city life. <i>The urban population.</i>
