Definitions of "Hue" as a noun

- *A colour or shade.*
- *The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.*
- *The attribute of a colour by virtue of which it is discernible as red, green, etc., and which is dependent on its dominant wavelength and independent of intensity or lightness.*
- *Character or aspect.*



Synonyms of "Hue" as a noun (18 Words)

- aspect** The visual percept of a region.
*The sun in Aries formed an adverse **aspect** with Uranus in Capricorn.*
- cast** A mould used to make an object by casting.
*She had a somewhat masculine **cast** of countenance.*
- character** A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something.
*The island is full of **character**.*
- chromaticity** The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.
- colour** Any of the major conventional colours used in coats of arms gules vert sable azure purple especially as opposed to the metals furs and stains.
*It was Devon Loch s first victory in the **colours** of his royal owner.*
- complexion** The coloring of a person's face.
*Diphthongs are **complexions** of vowels.*

kind	A category of things distinguished by some common characteristic or quality. <i>What kinds of desserts are there.</i>
light	Having abundant light or illumination. <i>The light of the sun.</i>
nature	The physical force regarded as causing and regulating the phenomena of the world. <i>It s not in her nature to listen to advice.</i>
nuance	A subtle difference in or shade of meaning, expression, or sound. <i>Without understanding the finer nuances you can t enjoy the humor.</i>
shade	An eyeshade. <i>The goal had more than a shade of good fortune about it.</i>
sort	A letter or piece in a font of type. <i>What sort of person is he.</i>
stamp	An instrument for stamping a pattern or mark in particular an engraved or inked block or die. <i>The stamp of boots on the bare floor.</i>
tincture	A quality of a given color that differs slightly from another color. <i>She could not keep a tincture of bitterness out of her voice.</i>
tinge	A slight but appreciable amount. <i>In their sound you ll find punky tinges and folky tinges.</i>
tint	An artificial dye for colouring the hair. <i>The sky was taking on an apricot tint.</i>
tone	A musical interval of two semitones. <i>Stained glass in vivid tones of red and blue.</i>
type	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The word element contains five different types of character.</i>

- *The water is the deepest hue of aquamarine.*

achromatic	Without colour. <i>Achromatic microscopes.</i>
azure	Color azure. <i>A flash of azure drew my eye to a kingfisher.</i>
blue	Turn blue. <i>A blue jay.</i>
<u>brightness</u>	Sunny, cloudless weather. <i>We can change the brightness of the bulb.</i>
brilliantly	In an exceptionally clever or talented way. <i>At night the town was brilliantly lit.</i>
color	Having or capable of producing colors. <i>A white color is made up of many different wavelengths of light.</i>

colored	Artificially produced; not natural. <i>Amber colored heads of grain.</i>
complexion	The general aspect or character of something. <i>The setting sun complexioned the hills.</i>
discolor	Change color, often in an undesired manner. <i>The detergent discolored my shirts.</i>
dye	Color with dye. <i>Blonde hair dye.</i>
ebony	Hard dark colored heartwood of the ebony tree used in cabinetwork and for piano keys. <i>His ebony hair.</i>
emblazon	Conspicuously inscribe or display a design on. <i>The Queen's coat of arms is emblazoned on the door panel.</i>
gloss	Give a shine or gloss to usually by rubbing. <i>Hair with a healthy gloss.</i>
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
iridescent	Varying in color when seen in different lights or from different angles. <i>A dragonfly hovered vibrating and iridescent.</i>
lightness	The visual effect of illumination on objects or scenes as created in pictures. <i>The lightness of balsa wood.</i>
monochrome	Painting done in a range of tones of a single color.
opalescent	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky opalescent or opaline luster.</i>
painted	Having makeup applied. <i>Brazen painted faces.</i>
pervade	(especially of a smell) spread through and be perceived in every part of. <i>A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.</i>
pigment	Acquire pigment become colored or imbued. <i>All the frescoes are painted with earth pigments.</i>
pigmentation	Coloration of living tissues by pigment.
pink	Become pink. <i>Bright pink lipstick.</i>
polychrome	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Modigliani continued to carve his large heads sometimes in polychrome until 1916.</i>

purple	Become purple. <i>Many purple passages.</i>
red	Denoting a red light or flag used as a signal to stop. <i>A glass of red wine.</i>
roseate	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The roseate glow of dawn.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>Archie s shoes got a quick shine from a boy with a cloth.</i>
tint	Dye someone s hair with a tint. <i>A tint of glamour.</i>
variegate	Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors. <i>The designer can variegate the object s colour and physical character as needed.</i>
