### Definitions of "Hue" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hue” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A colour or shade.*
- *The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.*
- *The attribute of a colour by virtue of which it is discernible as red, green, etc., and which is dependent on its dominant wavelength and independent of intensity or lightness.*
- *Character or aspect.*



## Synonyms of "Hue" as a noun (18 Words)

- aspect** The visual percept of a region.  
*The sun in Aries formed an adverse **aspect** with Uranus in Capricorn.*
- cast** A mould used to make an object by casting.  
*She had a somewhat masculine **cast** of countenance.*
- character** A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something.  
*The island is full of **character**.*
- chromaticity** The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.
- colour** Any of the major conventional colours used in coats of arms gules vert sable azure purple especially as opposed to the metals furs and stains.  
*It was Devon Loch s first victory in the **colours** of his royal owner.*
- complexion** The coloring of a person's face.  
*Diphthongs are **complexions** of vowels.*

<b>kind</b>	A category of things distinguished by some common characteristic or quality. <i>What <b>kinds</b> of desserts are there.</i>
<b>light</b>	Having abundant light or illumination. <i>The <b>light</b> of the sun.</i>
<b>nature</b>	The physical force regarded as causing and regulating the phenomena of the world. <i>It s not in her <b>nature</b> to listen to advice.</i>
<b>nuance</b>	A subtle difference in or shade of meaning, expression, or sound. <i>Without understanding the finer <b>nuances</b> you can t enjoy the humor.</i>
<b>shade</b>	An eyeshade. <i>The goal had more than a <b>shade</b> of good fortune about it.</i>
<b>sort</b>	A letter or piece in a font of type. <i>What <b>sort</b> of person is he.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	An instrument for stamping a pattern or mark in particular an engraved or inked block or die. <i>The <b>stamp</b> of boots on the bare floor.</i>
<b>tincture</b>	A quality of a given color that differs slightly from another color. <i>She could not keep a <b>tincture</b> of bitterness out of her voice.</i>
<b>tinge</b>	A slight but appreciable amount. <i>In their sound you ll find punky <b>tinges</b> and folky <b>tinges</b>.</i>
<b>tint</b>	An artificial dye for colouring the hair. <i>The sky was taking on an apricot <b>tint</b>.</i>
<b>tone</b>	A musical interval of two semitones. <i>Stained glass in vivid <b>tones</b> of red and blue.</i>
<b>type</b>	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The word element contains five different <b>types</b> of character.</i>

- *The water is the deepest hue of aquamarine.*

<b>blue</b>	Turn blue. <i>A <b>blue</b> jay.</i>
<b><u>brightness</u></b>	Sunny, cloudless weather. <i>We can change the <b>brightness</b> of the bulb.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	In an exceptionally clever or talented way. <i>At night the town was <b>brilliantly</b> lit.</i>
<b>color</b>	Having or capable of producing colors. <i>A white <b>color</b> is made up of many different wavelengths of light.</i>

<b>colored</b>	Artificially produced; not natural. <i>Amber <b>colored</b> heads of grain.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	The general aspect or character of something. <i>The setting sun <b>complexioned</b> the hills.</i>
<b>discolor</b>	Change color, often in an undesired manner. <i>The detergent <b>discolored</b> my shirts.</i>
<b>dye</b>	Color with dye. <i>Blonde hair <b>dye</b>.</i>
<b>ebony</b>	Hard dark colored heartwood of the ebony tree used in cabinetwork and for piano keys. <i>His <b>ebony</b> hair.</i>
<b>emblazon</b>	Conspicuously inscribe or display a design on. <i>The Queen's coat of arms is <b>emblazoned</b> on the door panel.</i>
<b>gloss</b>	Give a shine or gloss to usually by rubbing. <i>Hair with a healthy <b>gloss</b>.</i>
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>iridescent</b>	Varying in color when seen in different lights or from different angles. <i>A dragonfly hovered vibrating and <b>iridescent</b>.</i>
<b>lightness</b>	The visual effect of illumination on objects or scenes as created in pictures. <i>The <b>lightness</b> of balsa wood.</i>
<b>monochrome</b>	Painting done in a range of tones of a single color.
<b>opalescent</b>	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky <b>opalescent</b> or opaline luster.</i>
<b>painted</b>	Having makeup applied. <i>Brazen <b>painted</b> faces.</i>
<b>pervade</b>	(especially of a smell) spread through and be perceived in every part of. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b>pigment</b>	Acquire pigment become colored or imbued. <i>All the frescoes are painted with earth <b>pigments</b>.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	Coloration of living tissues by pigment.
<b>pink</b>	Become pink. <i>Bright <b>pink</b> lipstick.</i>
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Modigliani continued to carve his large heads sometimes in <b>polychrome</b> until 1916.</i>

<b>purple</b>	Become purple. <i>Many <b>purple</b> passages.</i>
<b>red</b>	Denoting a red light or flag used as a signal to stop. <i>A glass of <b>red</b> wine.</i>
<b>roseate</b>	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The <b>roseate</b> glow of dawn.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>Archie s shoes got a quick <b>shine</b> from a boy with a cloth.</i>
<b>tint</b>	Dye someone s hair with a tint. <i>A <b>tint</b> of glamour.</i>
<b>variegate</b>	Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors. <i>The designer can <b>variegate</b> the object s colour and physical character as needed.</i>
