| heavy | Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>Heavy grey clouds.</i> |
| like a sauna | Conforming in every respect. |
| like a turkish bath | Conforming in every respect. |

| muggy | (of the weather) unpleasantly warm and humid. <i>Muggy weather.</i> |
| <u>oppressive</u> | Marked by unjust severity or arbitrary behavior. <i>Oppressive laws.</i> |
| soupy | Having the appearance or consistency of soup. <i>A soupy fog.</i> |
| steamy | Depicting or involving passionate sexual activity. <i>Steamy sex scenes.</i> |
| <u>sticky</u> | Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>The relationship is going through a sticky patch.</i> |
| <u>stifling</u> | Making one feel constrained or oppressed. <i>The stifling formality of her family life.</i> |
| stuffy | (of a person) not receptive to new or unusual ideas; conventional and narrow-minded. <i>A stuffy feeling in my chest.</i> |
| <u>suffocating</u> | Causing difficulty in breathing especially through lack of fresh air and presence of heat. <i>Some marriages can at times feel suffocating.</i> |
| sultry | Characterized by oppressive heat and humidity. <i>A sultry look.</i> |

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| <u>blurry</u> | Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible. <i>My memories of him are blurry at best.</i> |
| <u>cloud</u> | Darken the sky with cloud. <i>The smoke clouded above the houses.</i> |
| <u>cloudy</u> | Uncertain; unclear. <i>A very grey cloudy day.</i> |
| condensation | Atmospheric moisture that has condensed because of cold. <i>The inside of the cab steamed up with condensation.</i> |
| <u>damp</u> | Damp air or atmosphere. <i>The muted notes should be produced by damping the strings at the seventh position.</i> |
| dampness | A slight wetness. <i>The dampness in the air.</i> |
| dank | Unpleasantly cool and humid. <i>Dank rain forests.</i> |
| <u>dusty</u> | Staid and uninteresting. <i>Patches of pale gold and dusty pink.</i> |
| <u>fog</u> | Make (a film, negative, or print) obscure or cloudy. <i>She stared at him confusion fogging her brain.</i> |
| <u>foggy</u> | Obscured by fog. <i>My memories of the event are foggy.</i> |
| <u>hazy</u> | Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.</i> |
| indistinct | Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>An indistinct memory.</i> |
| jungle | A style of dance music incorporating elements of ragga, hip-hop, and hard core and consisting of very fast electronic drum tracks and slower synthesized bass lines, originating in Britain in the early 1990s. <i>The lakes are hidden in dense jungle.</i> |
| <u>marsh</u> | New Zealand writer of detective stories (1899-1982). <i>Thousands of acres of marshland.</i> |
| marshland | Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Thousands of acres of marshland.</i> |

| marshy | Soft and watery. <i>The marshy ground towards the sea.</i> |
| misty | Full of, covered with, or accompanied by mist. <i>A misty out of focus silhouette.</i> |
| moist | Slightly wet. <i>The moist fertile soil.</i> |
| moisture | Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>The air was constantly heavy with moisture.</i> |
| morass | A complicated or confused situation. <i>She would become lost in a morass of lies and explanations.</i> |
| muddy | Cause to become muddy. <i>Muddy coffee.</i> |
| quagmire | A soft boggy area of land that gives way underfoot. <i>A legal quagmire.</i> |
| rain | Rain falls. <i>Bombs rained down.</i> |
| soak | Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>The rain poured down soaking their hair.</i> |
| soggy | (of soil) soft and watery. <i>The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately soggy.</i> |
| swamp | Overwhelm with an excessive amount of something; inundate. <i>A huge wave swamped the canoes.</i> |
| swampy | Characteristic of or resembling a swamp. <i>Swampy bayous.</i> |
| vapor | The process of becoming a vapor. |
| wet | Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating. <i>Drops of wet gleamed on the window.</i> |
| wetland | Land consisting of marshes or swamps; saturated land. <i>The draining of British wetlands.</i> |
