<b>airless</b>	Lacking fresh air. <i>A dusty <b>airless</b> basement.</i>
<b>clammy</b>	Unpleasantly damp and sticky or slimy to touch. <i><b>Clammy</b> weather.</i>
<b>close</b>	Fitting closely but comfortably. <i>A <b>close</b> study.</i>
<b>fuggy</b>	(British informal) poorly ventilated. <i>A <b>fuggy</b> pub.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i><b>Heavy</b> grey clouds.</i>
<b>like a sauna</b>	Conforming in every respect.
<b>like a turkish bath</b>	Conforming in every respect.

<b>muggy</b>	(of the weather) unpleasantly warm and humid. <i><b>Muggy</b> weather.</i>
<b><u>oppressive</u></b>	Marked by unjust severity or arbitrary behavior. <i><b>Oppressive</b> laws.</i>
<b>soupy</b>	Having the appearance or consistency of soup. <i>A <b>soupy</b> fog.</i>
<b>steamy</b>	Depicting or involving passionate sexual activity. <i><b>Steamy</b> sex scenes.</i>
<b><u>sticky</u></b>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>The relationship is going through a <b>sticky</b> patch.</i>
<b><u>stifling</u></b>	Making one feel constrained or oppressed. <i>The <b>stifling</b> formality of her family life.</i>
<b>stuffy</b>	(of a person) not receptive to new or unusual ideas; conventional and narrow-minded. <i>A <b>stuffy</b> feeling in my chest.</i>
<b><u>suffocating</u></b>	Causing difficulty in breathing especially through lack of fresh air and presence of heat. <i>Some marriages can at times feel <b>suffocating</b>.</i>
<b>sultry</b>	Characterized by oppressive heat and humidity. <i>A <b>sultry</b> look.</i>

<a href="#">blurry</a>	Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible. <i>My memories of him are <b>blurry</b> at best.</i>
<a href="#">cloud</a>	Darken the sky with cloud. <i>The smoke <b>clouded</b> above the houses.</i>
<a href="#">cloudy</a>	Uncertain; unclear. <i>A very grey <b>cloudy</b> day.</i>
<b>condensation</b>	Atmospheric moisture that has condensed because of cold. <i>The inside of the cab steamed up with <b>condensation</b>.</i>
<a href="#">damp</a>	Damp air or atmosphere. <i>The muted notes should be produced by <b>damping</b> the strings at the seventh position.</i>
<b>dampness</b>	A slight wetness. <i>The <b>dampness</b> in the air.</i>
<b>dank</b>	Unpleasantly cool and humid. <i><b>Dank</b> rain forests.</i>
<a href="#">dusty</a>	Staid and uninteresting. <i>Patches of pale gold and <b>dusty</b> pink.</i>
<a href="#">fog</a>	Make (a film, negative, or print) obscure or cloudy. <i>She stared at him confusion <b>fogging</b> her brain.</i>
<a href="#">foggy</a>	Obscured by fog. <i>My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hazy</a>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely <b>hazy</b>.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>An <b>indistinct</b> memory.</i>
<b>jungle</b>	A style of dance music incorporating elements of ragga, hip-hop, and hard core and consisting of very fast electronic drum tracks and slower synthesized bass lines, originating in Britain in the early 1990s. <i>The lakes are hidden in dense <b>jungle</b>.</i>
<a href="#">marsh</a>	New Zealand writer of detective stories (1899-1982). <i>Thousands of acres of <b>marshland</b>.</i>
<b>marshland</b>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Thousands of acres of <b>marshland</b>.</i>

<b>marshy</b>	Soft and watery. <i>The <b>marshy</b> ground towards the sea.</i>
<b>misty</b>	Full of, covered with, or accompanied by mist. <i>A <b>misty</b> out of focus silhouette.</i>
<b>moist</b>	Slightly wet. <i>The <b>moist</b> fertile soil.</i>
<b>moisture</b>	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>The air was constantly heavy with <b>moisture</b>.</i>
<b>morass</b>	A complicated or confused situation. <i>She would become lost in a <b>morass</b> of lies and explanations.</i>
<b>muddy</b>	Cause to become muddy. <i><b>Muddy</b> coffee.</i>
<b>quagmire</b>	A soft boggy area of land that gives way underfoot. <i>A legal <b>quagmire</b>.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Rain falls. <i>Bombs <b>rained</b> down.</i>
<b>soak</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>The rain poured down <b>soaking</b> their hair.</i>
<b>soggy</b>	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately <b>soggy</b>.</i>
<b>swamp</b>	Overwhelm with an excessive amount of something; inundate. <i>A huge wave <b>swamped</b> the canoes.</i>
<b>swampy</b>	Characteristic of or resembling a swamp. <i><b>Swampy</b> bayous.</i>
<b>vapor</b>	The process of becoming a vapor.
<b>wet</b>	Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating. <i>Drops of <b>wet</b> gleamed on the window.</i>
<b>wetland</b>	Land consisting of marshes or swamps; saturated land. <i>The draining of British <b>wetlands</b>.</i>
