## Associations of "Humorously" (30 Words)

<b>amusing</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>Such a likeable <b>amusing</b> man.</i>
<b><u>badinage</u></b>	Humorous or witty conversation. <i>He developed a nice line in <b>badinage</b> with the Labour leader.</i>
<b><u>banter</u></b>	Be silly or tease one another. <i>There was much good natured <b>banter</b>.</i>
<b>buffoonery</b>	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and <b>buffoonery</b>.</i>
<b>comic</b>	A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts. <i>A <b>comic</b> actor.</i>
<b>comical</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A series of <b>comical</b> misunderstandings.</i>
<b>conversationalist</b>	Someone skilled at conversation. <i>An entertaining <b>conversationalist</b>.</i>
<b>droll</b>	Comical in an odd or whimsical manner. <i>His unique brand of <b>droll</b> self mockery.</i>
<b><u>entertaining</u></b>	Agreeably diverting. <i>A charming and <b>entertaining</b> companion.</i>
<b><u>exhilaration</u></b>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the <b>exhilaration</b> of victory.</i>
<b>facetious</b>	Treating serious issues with deliberately inappropriate humour; flippant. <i><b>Facetious</b> remarks.</i>
<b>fun</b>	A source of fun. <i>She s full of <b>fun</b>.</i>
<b>funny</b>	Experiencing odd bodily sensations. <i>I was trying to make a <b>funny</b> but failed miserably.</i>

<b><u>hilarious</u></b>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>Her <b>hilarious</b> novel.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can't survive in the army without a sense of <b>humor</b>.</i>
<b>jest</b>	Act in a funny or teasing way. <i>He laughed unpleasantly at his own <b>jest</b>.</i>
<b>jesting</b>	The action of saying or doing something for amusement. <i>Laughing and <b>jesting</b> were out of the question.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Playful or humorous. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>His voice was <b>jocular</b>.</i>
<b><u>joke</u></b>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>Public transport is a <b>joke</b>.</i>
<b><u>jolly</u></b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>Ideas to <b>jolly</b> up a winter's party.</i>
<b>laugh</b>	Something that causes laughter a source of fun amusement or derision. <i>She couldn't help <b>laughing</b> at his jokes.</i>
<b><u>quirky</u></b>	Informal terms; strikingly unconventional. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly <b>quirky</b>.</i>
<b>raconteur</b>	A person who tells anecdotes in a skilful and amusing way. <i>A colourful <b>raconteur</b>.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>skit</b>	A short informal performance intended to educate or inform. <i>Students will create <b>skits</b> about bullying and go to each elementary school to perform them.</i>
<b>slapstick</b>	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i><b>Slapstick</b> style of humor.</i>
<b>waggish</b>	Humorous in a playful, mischievous, or facetious manner. <i>Muskrat Castle as the house has been facetiously named by some <b>waggish</b> officer.</i>
<b><u>whimsical</u></b>	Acting or behaving in a capricious manner. <i>The victim of <b>whimsical</b> persecutions.</i>
<b><u>witty</u></b>	Combining clever conception and facetious expression. <i>His sermons were unpredictably <b>witty</b> and satirical as well as eloquent.</i>
