amusing	Arousing or provoking laughter. Such a likeable amusing man.

<u>banter</u>	Be silly or tease one another. There was much good natured banter .
buffoonery	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. The film is full of wordplay and buffoonery .
comic	A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts. <i>A</i> <i>comic</i> <i>actor</i> .
comical	Arousing or provoking laughter. A series of comical misunderstandings.
conversationalist	Someone skilled at conversation. An entertaining conversationalist .
droll	Comical in an odd or whimsical manner. His unique brand of droll self mockery.
<u>entertaining</u>	Agreeably diverting. A charming and entertaining companion.
<u>exhilaration</u>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. They felt the exhilaration of victory.
facetious	Treating serious issues with deliberately inappropriate humour; flippant. <i>Facetious</i> remarks.
fun	A source of fun. She s full of fun .
funny	Experiencing odd bodily sensations. I was trying to make a funny but failed miserably.



<u>hilarious</u>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. You can t survive in the army without a sense of humor .
jest	Act in a funny or teasing way. He laughed unpleasantly at his own jest .
jesting	The action of saying or doing something for amusement. Laughing and jesting were out of the question.
jocose	Playful or humorous. A jocose allusion.
jocular	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>His voice was jocular.</i>
<u>joke</u>	Tell a joke speak humorously. Public transport is a joke .
jolly	To certain extent or degree. Ideas to jolly up a winter s party.
laugh	Something that causes laughter a source of fun amusement or derision. <i>She couldn t help laughing at his jokes.</i>
<u>quirky</u>	Informal terms; strikingly unconventional. Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky .
raconteur	A person who tells anecdotes in a skilful and amusing way. A colourful raconteur .
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
skit	A short informal performance intended to educate or inform. Students will create skit s about bullying and go to each elementary school to perform them.
slapstick	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>Slapstick</i> style of humor.
waggish	Humorous in a playful, mischievous, or facetious manner. Muskrat Castle as the house has been facetiously named by some waggish officer.
<u>whimsical</u>	Acting or behaving in a capricious manner. The victim of whimsical persecutions.
<u>witty</u>	Combining clever conception and facetious expression. His sermons were unpredictably witty and satirical as well as eloquent.
