Associations of "Humorously" (30 Words)

amusing	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>Such a likeable amusing man.</i>
<u>badinage</u>	Humorous or witty conversation. <i>He developed a nice line in badinage with the Labour leader.</i>
<u>banter</u>	Be silly or tease one another. <i>There was much good natured banter.</i>
buffoonery	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and buffoonery.</i>
comic	A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts. <i>A comic actor.</i>
comical	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A series of comical misunderstandings.</i>
conversationalist	Someone skilled at conversation. <i>An entertaining conversationalist.</i>
droll	Comical in an odd or whimsical manner. <i>His unique brand of droll self mockery.</i>
<u>entertaining</u>	Agreeably diverting. <i>A charming and entertaining companion.</i>
<u>exhilaration</u>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
facetious	Treating serious issues with deliberately inappropriate humour; flippant. <i>Facetious remarks.</i>
fun	A source of fun. <i>She s full of fun.</i>
funny	Experiencing odd bodily sensations. <i>I was trying to make a funny but failed miserably.</i>

<u>hilarious</u>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can't survive in the army without a sense of humor.</i>
jest	Act in a funny or teasing way. <i>He laughed unpleasantly at his own jest.</i>
jesting	The action of saying or doing something for amusement. <i>Laughing and jesting were out of the question.</i>
jocose	Playful or humorous. <i>A jocose allusion.</i>
jocular	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>His voice was jocular.</i>
<u>joke</u>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>Public transport is a joke.</i>
<u>jolly</u>	To certain extent or degree. <i>Ideas to jolly up a winter's party.</i>
laugh	Something that causes laughter a source of fun amusement or derision. <i>She couldn't help laughing at his jokes.</i>
<u>quirky</u>	Informal terms; strikingly unconventional. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky.</i>
raconteur	A person who tells anecdotes in a skilful and amusing way. <i>A colourful raconteur.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
skit	A short informal performance intended to educate or inform. <i>Students will create skits about bullying and go to each elementary school to perform them.</i>
slapstick	Characterized by horseplay and physical action. <i>Slapstick style of humor.</i>
waggish	Humorous in a playful, mischievous, or facetious manner. <i>Muskrat Castle as the house has been facetiously named by some waggish officer.</i>
<u>whimsical</u>	Acting or behaving in a capricious manner. <i>The victim of whimsical persecutions.</i>
<u>witty</u>	Combining clever conception and facetious expression. <i>His sermons were unpredictably witty and satirical as well as eloquent.</i>
