ascend	Move to a better position in life or to a better job. <i>Jupiter ascends.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The ascending stems of chickweed.</i>
ascent	An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>The ascent grew steeper.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>A range of measures to boost tourism.</i>
climb	The act of climbing something. <i>Prices climbed steeply.</i>
climbing	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i>
elevate	Raise or lift (something) to a higher position. <i>The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.</i>
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing elevator shoes.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
high	A high point level or figure. <i>The high point of his career.</i>
hoist	Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>She hoisted her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career ladder.</i>

lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>She staged a magnificent comeback to lift the British Open title.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
precipitate	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Vesuvius precipitated its fiery destructive rage on Herculaneum.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>Some regulation is still required to promote competition.</i>
raise	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>The galloping horse raised a cloud of dust.</i>
rise	Rise to one's feet. <i>He felt the hairs rise on the back of his neck.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Sloping upward. <i>A rising young politician.</i>
scale	Especially of the skin form scales. <i>The troops scaled the walls of the fort.</i>
soar	Maintain height in the air without flapping wings or using engine power. <i>The bird spread its wings and soared into the air.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
underpin	Support from beneath. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i>
uphill	Upward on a hill or incline. <i>Follow the track uphill.</i>
upstairs	With respect to the mind. <i>An upstairs bedroom.</i>
upward	Directed up. <i>The fragments flew upwards.</i>
vertically	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. <i>The bacteria are vertically transmitted from mother to offspring.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Viewers can zoom in on any part of the image they want to see better.</i>
