<u>elevate</u>	Raise or lift (something) to a higher position. The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing <b>elevator</b> shoes.
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
high	A high point level or figure. The <b>high</b> point of his career.
<u>hoist</u>	Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>She <b>hoist</b>ed her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career ladder</i> .



lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. She staged a magnificent comeback to <b>lift</b> the British Open title.
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. Vesuvius <b>precipitate</b> d its fiery destructive rage on Herculaneum.
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. Some regulation is still required to <b>promote</b> competition.
raise	Raise the level or amount of something. The galloping horse <b>raise</b> d a cloud of dust.
rise	Rise to one s feet. He felt the hairs <b>rise</b> on the back of his neck.
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
rising	Sloping upward. A <b>rising</b> young politician.
scale	Especially of the skin form scales. The troops <b>scale</b> d the walls of the fort.
<u>soar</u>	Maintain height in the air without flapping wings or using engine power. The bird spread its wings and <b>soar</b> ed into the air.
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<u>underpin</u>	Support from beneath. The theme of honour <b>underpin</b> ning the two books.
uphill	Upward on a hill or incline. Follow the track <b>uphill</b> .
upstairs	With respect to the mind. An <b>upstairs</b> bedroom.
upward	Directed up. The fragments flew <b>upward</b> s.
vertically	(with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next. The bacteria are <b>vertically</b> transmitted from mother to offspring.
<u>zoom</u>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. Viewers can <b>zoom</b> in on any part of the image they want to see better.
