Definitions of "Hurricane" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "hurricane" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A storm with a violent wind, in particular a tropical cyclone in the Caribbean.
- A wind of force 12 on the Beaufort scale (equal to or exceeding 64 knots or 118 km/h).
- A severe tropical cyclone usually with heavy rains and winds moving at 63-136 knots (12 on the Beaufort scale.
- A severe tropical cyclone usually with heavy rains and winds moving a 73-136 knots (12 on the Beaufort scale.





Synonyms of "Hurricane" as a noun (10 Words)

(meteorology) rapid inward circulation of air masses about a low pressure cyclone

center; circling counterclockwise in the northern hemisphere and clockwise

in the southern.

(on the Beaufort scale) a wind of force 8 (34-40 knots or 63-74 km/h). **gale**

Gale force winds battered the North Sea coast.

A loud cry. squall

He emitted a short mournful **squall**.

Storm windows. **storm**

The **storm**s that had characterized their relationship had died away.

A powerful and destructive storm that affects a very large area.

superstorm Britain faces a growing threat from **superstorm**s that could bring at least 10

more rain than today s worst downpours.

A violent wind.

tempest A **tempest** swept over the island.



tornado

A mobile, destructive vortex of violently rotating winds having the appearance

of a funnel-shaped cloud and advancing beneath a large storm system.

Teenagers caught up in a **tornado** of sexual confusion.

typhoon A tropical storm in the region of the Indian or western Pacific oceans.

whirlwind Used with reference to a very energetic person or a tumultuous process.

A whirlwind of activity.

windstorm A storm with very strong wind but little or no rain or snow; a gale.



Usage Examples of "Hurricane" as a noun

- A powerful hurricane hit the Florida coast.
- The manager resigned in a hurricane of disagreement.





Associations of "Hurricane" (30 Words)

A large or overwhelming number of things arriving suddenly.

A **blizzard** of lawsuits.

breeze Come or go in a casual or light-hearted manner.

It **breeze**s most evenings at the shore.

cloudburst A heavy rain.

convolute Rolled longitudinally upon itself, as a leaf in the bud.

A convolute petal.

convolve Curl, wind, or twist together.

A system of winds rotating inwards to an area of low barometric pressure,

cyclone with an anticlockwise (northern hemisphere) or clockwise (southern

hemisphere) circulation; a depression.

deluge Fill quickly beyond capacity; as with a liquid.

A **deluge** of complaints.



downpour A heavy fall of rain.

A sudden **downpour** had filled the gutters and drains.

eddy Flow in a circular current, of liquids.

An **eddy** of chill air swirled into the carriage.

flood Cover or submerge an area with water in a flood.

A tide in the affairs of men which taken at the **flood** leads on to fortune.

An outburst of laughter.

I slept well despite the howling **gale**s outside.

Of the wind blow in gusts.

The tree was bent almost double by the **qust**.

Hail falls.

hail A hail of bullets.

purl Knit with a purl stitch.

Knit one **purl** one.

rainfall The fall of rain.

The absorption of further supplies from **rainfalls**.

rainstorm A storm with heavy rain.

snow Fall as snow.

The first **snow** of the season.

squall Blow in a squall.

When it **squall**s a prudent sailor reefs his sails.

Storm windows.

He **storm**ed out of the house.

swirlMove in a twisting or spiralling pattern.
The smoke was **swirl**ing around him.

A violent commotion or disturbance.

A raging tempest.

thunderstorm A storm with thunder and lightning and typically also heavy rain or hail.

A mobile, destructive vortex of violently rotating winds having the

tornado appearance of a funnel-shaped cloud and advancing beneath a large storm

system.

A swirling **vortex** of emotions.

A quickly rotating mass of water in a river or sea into which objects may be

wind Catch the scent of get wind of.
