- mate** South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate.
*He lost the **mate** to his shoe.*
- partner** A person who is a member of a partnership.
*Scotland is the rest of the UK s second biggest trading **partner**.*
- spouse** A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.

Synonyms of "Husband" as a verb (8 Words)

be frugal with	Spend or use time.
<u>conserve</u>	Retain (a particular amino acid, nucleotide, or sequence of these) unchanged in different protein or DNA molecules. <i>Highly conserved regions of the protein.</i>
economise	Spend sparingly, avoid the waste of.
economize	Spend sparingly, avoid the waste of. <i>The less fortunate will have to economize now.</i>
economize on	Use cautiously and frugally.
manage thriftily	Be successful; achieve a goal.
use economically	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.
use sparingly	Avail oneself to.



Usage Examples of "Husband" as a verb

- *She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.*



Associations of "Husband" (30 Words)

- alimony** Financial support that a person is ordered by a court to give to their spouse during separation or following divorce; maintenance.
*He is said to have paid 300 000 **alimony** to his first wife.*
- bachelor** Lead a bachelor s existence.
*One of the country s most eligible **bachelors**.*
- beau** A boyfriend or male admirer.
- bigamist** Someone who marries one person while already legally married to another.
- bigamy** The offense of marrying someone while you have a living spouse from whom no valid divorce has occurred.
- bride** A woman on her wedding day or just before and after the event.
*The **bride** and groom left early last night.*
- concubine** A mistress.

<u>couple</u>	A small indefinite number. <i>The beetles may couple up to form a pair.</i>
<u>divorce</u>	Get a divorce formally terminate a marriage. <i>Her divorce from her first husband.</i>
<u>estranged</u>	(of a wife or husband) no longer living with their spouse. <i>Harriet felt more estranged from her daughter than ever.</i>
ex	A woman who was formerly a particular man's wife. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
fiance	A man who is engaged to be married.
fiancee	A woman who is engaged to be married.
<u>girlfriend</u>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>He lives with his girlfriend.</i>
honeymoon	Spend a honeymoon. <i>The new President's honeymoon period.</i>
<u>lover</u>	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>He was a great lover of cats.</i>
marriage	A combination or mixture of elements. <i>Her music is a marriage of funk jazz and hip hop.</i>
married	Married people. <i>Married life.</i>
marry	(of a parent or guardian) give (a son or daughter) in marriage. <i>They had no plans to marry.</i>
mistress	A woman (other than the man's wife) having a sexual relationship with a married man. <i>A mistress of the sound bite she is famed for the acidity of her tongue.</i>
morganatic	Of a marriage between one of royal or noble birth and one of lower rank; valid but with the understanding that the rank of the inferior remains unchanged and offspring do not succeed to titles or property of the superior. <i>He contracted a morganatic marriage with a German born actress.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
<u>paramour</u>	A lover, especially the illicit partner of a married person.
<u>partner</u>	Provide with a partner. <i>Scotland is the rest of the UK's second biggest trading partner.</i>
polygamy	The condition of bearing some flowers with stamens only, some with pistils only, and some with both, on the same or different plants.
<u>spouse</u>	A husband or wife, considered in relation to their partner.

suitor A prospective buyer of a business or corporation.
*She decided to marry her **suitor**.*

wed Having been taken in marriage.
*We were **wed** the following week.*

widower A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried.
*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*

wife The wife of a person with a specified occupation.
*A clergy **wife**.*
